Workshop Objective - To learn flagging procedures to become a certified flagger.

Workshop Description - This workshop is a combination of lecture, manuals, video and hands-on problem solving with regards to flagging in a work zone. The five parts of a Traffic Control Work Zone will be discussed. Flagging duties and responsibilities will be taught. Safety, uniformity and liability issues will also be covered. Montana flagger certificates will be issued to participants successful in completing an exam at the end of the workshop.

Who Should Attend - Road department employees from cities, counties, MDT, the Forest Service and Park Service, as well as BIA and Tribal employees will all benefit from attending this workshop.
