Former State Sen. Jack Nystrom dies

Former Iowa State Senator Jack Nystrom, 71, of Boone, died Sunday morning at Boone County Hospital.

He served in the Iowa House of Representatives from 1971 to 1972, and served in the Iowa State Senate from 1973 to 1991. He resigned from the



Senate to serve

under former Iowa Gov. Terry Branstad.

"I'm going to miss Jack. He was a good friend and a great guy," Branstad, currently president of Des Moines University Osteopathic Medical Center, said Tuesday.

When Branstad was appointed lieutenant governor, he was told by sources that he should work closely with Jack because of Jack's vast knowledge of the Senate issues and its members. Branstad said he'd have weekly meetings with Jack. The two became close friends.

"(Jack) was a very conscientious senator, and he worked very hard for his constituents," Branstad said.

"He had many allies in the Legislature. He was very helpful and a fun guy to be with. He had a good relationship with both the Republicans and the Democrats.

He had good friends on both sides of the aisle," Branstad added.

Jack worked hard on many of the constituent issues, particularly for IPERS, or the retirement system for public employees. His assistance was appreciated by local public employee constituents such as the Department of Transportation workers, according to Branstad.

From 1991 to 1994, Jack was appointed as the director of the Iowa Department of Commerce, and then from 1994 to 2000, he was appointed the administrator for the Iowa Alcoholic Beverage Division, where he served until retirement.

He was also a Boone businessman, working along with his father, former Senator Clifford "Dutch" Nystrom in Nystrom Implement Company and Nystrom Motors, Inc. He operated Nystrom Motors, Inc., for 27 years in Boone, from 1955 to 1982. He knew his constituents very well because of those business ties and because his father also served in the Legislature, according to Branstad. "He was proud of that fact, and he always had some great stories to tell," Branstad indicated.

Funeral services were this morning at the First Baptist Church in Boone. A complete obituary appears on page 2.
