Want Your Child to Progress in Band Faster????

Here are some things that will help your young adult to improve their playing skills:

- <u>STUDY PRIVATELY</u>! Students who take private lessons from a qualified instructor will improve quicker. The more diligent they are in practicing what their private teacher and band director tell them the better player they will be.
- <u>PLAY A TOP QUALITY INSTRUMENT</u>!! We all tend to do things we enjoy!! Playing a quality instrument is much more fun (not to mention MUCH EASIER) than playing one that is a struggle. If your child is playing the same instrument that they started on years ago it is probably time to upgrade. Ask Mr. Connell or Mr. Vernon for guidance. <u>THIS IS AN INVESTMENT</u> IN THE MOST VALUABLE THING IN YOUR LIFE: YOUR CHILD!!

SWING CENTRAL JAZZ ANNOUNCES TWELVE HIGH SCHOOL JAZZ BANDS SELECTED TO PARTICIPATE IN 2015 SAVANNAH MUSIC FESTIVAL

Savannah, Georgia – Twelve of the nation's top high school jazz bands have been selected to participate in the ninth annual *SWING CENTRAL JAZZ* High School Jazz Band Competition & Workshop, an event produced by the Savannah Music Festival (SMF). Pianist/composer Marcus Roberts leads a group of 23 esteemed musicians/educators as the Associate Artistic Director, along with Associate Director Jim Ketch, trumpet player and Director of Jazz Studies at UNC Chapel Hill.

Participating students work with jazz masters across three days, perform in the "Jazz on the River" showcase on Savannah's River Street, play in competition rounds, and attend a variety of SMF performances during their stay, which takes place from March 25 through 27, 2015. "We were thrilled with the quality of all this year's applicants. This was our most competitive year, and it was difficult to narrow the field," says Associate Artistic Director Marcus Roberts. "Leading Swing Central Jazz is a highlight for me every year. Our group approach to instruction immerses students in big band jazz, and after three intense days, students, band directors and clinicians walk away inspired by this great art form."

- Newport High School Jazz I, directed by Meagan Mangum (Bellevue, WA)
- Overton High School Blue Jazz Ensemble, directed by Jeff Huddleston (Memphis, TN)

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Dixie Classic Grand National Invitational Concert Band Festival

Grissom Bands will be performing in a NATIONAL symphonic and concert band competition in Chattanooga, Tennessee on Saturday, April 25. <u>This is a required performance for everyone</u> *in Symphonic I, Symphonic II, and Concert Band.* Our bands have been very successful in the Festival in the past (3 National Championships), and we hope to continue that success. Bands from throughout the country will be competing. There is a \$45 fee for transportation (charter bus) that is due April 1. Make checks out to Grissom BPA. This is not an overnight trip.

Grissom Band has been invited to perform in the Waikiki Thanksgiving parade in honor of the 75th anniversary of the bombing of Pearl Harbor. We will also perform at other venues including the Pearl Harbor museum and on the Ford Island dock for the USS Missouri. NOTES FROM THE TREASURERS

Scrip News



Easter and Mother's Day are just around the corner, scrip is a great way to support the band and provide that someone special with a nice evening out or gift.

There are many local merchants who participate in the Scrip program. If there is a store that you shop at frequently, you should check the merchant lists posted on the Grissom Band website <u>http://www.grissomband.com/fundraisersspirit.html</u> to see if they are a part of the program. We keep a variety of Scrip merchant cards on hand, but there are hundreds of merchants that participate, and I typically place orders a couple of times a month. So, if you know that you always go to Rosie's on Saturday night or you always go to Wal-Mart to buy your gas, contact me and purchase some Scrip cards to keep on hand for those trips. If you already plan to frequent any of the participating merchants, why not do it with Scrip cards to generate money for the band and your student's account?

Here's how the program works. The Great Lakes Scrip Center sells gift cards to the band at less than face value. The band then sells the gift cards at face value. How does that help you? When you purchase one of these gift cards, you designate your student to receive the credit. The band takes the money that they made from the sale of the gift card and splits that profit with 40% going to your designated student's account and 60% going to the band general fund. The amount will vary by merchant and some are more generous than others. It may not seem like a lot when you look at it on a card by card basis, but the more you buy, the quicker it will add up.
