

3rd Annual SDSU Construction Engineering and **Management Program GALA an Outstanding** Success!!!

WOW!!!! The 3rd Annual SDSU J.R. Filanc Construction Engineering and Management Program GALA was held Saturday night in the new Conrad Prebys Aztec Student Union and it was an outstanding success. Just over 400 attended the GALA, more than double the past two GALAs. As a result of this fundraiser, a check for just over \$120,000 will be written to the program later this week to help the CEM Program handle costs during the next 12 months that the State Legislature will not cover for CEM faculty and students. State funding for all SDSU programs has been reduced by 35% since 2007, and the CEM Program has had to share in the reductions just like the other campus programs.

The CEM GALA was initiated in 2012....the first GALA raised about \$60,000 for the Program. The second was held in 2013, and raised \$55,000. This year Gala Chair Dave Carlin, Soltek Pacific and AGC's 2012 President, was assisted by a GALA Steering Committee that included the CEO's of firms that have employed two or more graduates of the program. Steering Committee members each contributed to the Gala's Silent Auction, purchased a table, and attended the event with the leadership of each of their firms. Call for Contractors- Summer Jobs Program By Marcy Knopman, Staff Coordinator Summer Jobs Program

The Construction Education/Foundation for Success Committee is seeking contractors for the Summer Jobs Program for students attending the Stanley Foster School of Engineering, Innovation & Design, (EID); formerly known as Construction Tech Academy. Firms who volunteer to provide summer jobs for these students will be asked to accept a student into their company for 8 weeks (June 23 - August 15), Monday-Friday, 8 hours a day. Students will receive a minimum of \$10-12 per hour. The committee believes that the Summer Jobs Program allows the very diverse student body at EID to gain valuable industry exposure and meaningful work experience.

EID has given the construction industry a source of highly qualified students that have excellent construction educations, and are focused on entering the industry...now we want to make sure we do not lose these excellent prospects to another industry. Many students employed during the summer led to procuring full time positions, by that same contractor, once they graduated from the CEM Program at SDSU.

During the 8-week period, the company will expose student to primary areas of experience. Our goal is to familiarize these students with a number of aspects of the day-to-to-day operations of a construction company. Click **here** for suggested job duties.

Description of the Summer Jobs Program:

Provide 8 weeks of meaningful work experience for the student. During the 8week period, the company will expose student to primary areas of experience. A sample rotation follows (rotation of modules will be flexible per company).

Estimating Rotation

This 2-week rotation provides the student an opportunity to work with your estimating staff. The student will assist your staff with plans and specs distribution, soliciting bids, observing your operation on bid day, getting a "feel" for how an estimate is put together, etc.



Apprenticeship Information

This 2-week rotation provides the student the opportunity to work with your P.M. and P.E.'s. Student should be given the opportunity to visit job sites, attend project meetings, help process paperwork, and observe the rewards and challenges experienced on a day-to-day basis by your P.M.'s and P.E.'s.

Office/Administrative/Accounting Rotation

This 2-week rotation provides the student the opportunity to participate in the office and administrative operations of your company. The students will engage in such tasks like filing, basic accounting functions, stuffing envelopes, etc. Students will no doubt learn the importance of these tasks, but will also continue to become familiar with the workings of a construction company.

General Superintendent/Safety Director Rotation

A final 2-week rotation involves the student working with your staff who is involved in your job site operations. The student will travel from job site to job site, and observing the day-to-day operations. Often, this could also involve spending time in a jobsite trailer and assisting with paperwork, etc., that is required at the site of construction. As a general rule, the student would be too young to actually perform labor or craft work on a site, but could perform the functions detailed above.

San Diego Unified's Failed Employment of District Residents!!

During the 2009 battle over the adoption of SDUSD's union-only Project Stabilization Agreement (PSA), one of the main arguments our friends Tom Lemmon, head of the San Diego Building Trades, and Richard Barrera, then President of the SDUSD Board, used to justify the adoption of the union-only PSA, was that the affiliation with the unions would allow the District to focus hiring on certain groups of residents. On page 10 of the PSA, (which many of us call a Project Labor Agreement (PLA)), Section 3.5 states that 100% of those working as craft workers on the PSA projects would reside in the County; 70% of those working on the PSA projects would be residents of the San Diego Unified School District; and 35% of the craft workers would be in selected areas of the SDUSD that have high unemployment rates, etc.

Well.....now that the PSA has been utilized for just about five years, it would seem to be a good time to see if the promises that were made by Tom and Richard (who is now on the School Board, and was recently hired as the head of the AFL-CIO in San Diego) are being kept. AGC and others were highly skeptical that Lemmon and Barrera could even come close to delivering on these promises.

On March 6th the Citizen's Oversight Committee's Construction Subcommittee held a meeting, and reviewed a document called the.......

PSA Workforce Utilization Summary Report.

Since the PSA's inception, 29.7% of the craft workers were residents of targeted SDUSD zip codes. The goal is 35%.

Since the PSA's inception, 39% of the craft workers were residents of SDUSD zip codes. The goal is 70%.

Nearly all craft workers have been residents of the County....which is true on most construction sites in San Diego County.

One problem with the statistics.....many of us are skeptical of the counting methods. We've inquired about this in the past, and there was no real response from the District.

We wonder why the report, that details the participation, does not report on "hours worked" rather than "number of workers"? If an individual works 8 hours on a job, do the statistics published by the District count that person the same as a person that works 40 hours? Obviously, if the District is just "counting bodies" and not hours worked, the statistics may look better for the District's goals, or they may look worse.

So....SDUSD, how about a report that details "hours worked" on all PSA sites in these categories?!

We look forward to your response.

General Contractors, Specialty Contractors, and Affiliate members to spend some time together and to make the lasting relationships that are so important to success in our industry.


