TECHNOLOGY TIME

One of Grade 4's learning focus this term is Technology. We have been learning all about creating design briefs, building items following the design briefs, testing the suitability of what we have designed and making amendments.

We began the unit of work by designing and creating a birdhouse. Students were challenged to design and build a birdhouse that would attract a bird in their neighbourhood. The birdhouse needed indoor and outdoor perches and be able to hang and support the weight of golf ball.

We are currently working on designing and building a desktop caddy for our school equipment. All of our materials are recycled so that we are using materials which would otherwise become rubbish. Students have brought in a variety of containers from home to create something amazing. We will keep you posted!



Mastering Economics in Grade 6

This week our Economics Investigation expands to “group decision making and company research” this is in preparation for the upcoming year 6 market.

Learning Intention: *In this session I will learn how to delegate responsibilities and workloads in relation to making a business profitable.*

Success Criteria: *I can identify the importance and responsibilities of a CEO, Marketing Executive, Marketing assistant and Finance Manager.*

In this task the students were required to create responsibilities and expectations for each of the four different market positions available. Each student chose a group of four peers to work with for this activity. Students had previously researched what makes a business function and profitable. This activity allowed students to experience the group expectations and rolls that will impact the way they will choose their final group, and what products they will sell in their year 6 markets.
