### **Daily Schedule**

8:15 am - 3:25 pm

If you are dropping your child off in the morning, please be mindful of the usually lengthy morning traffic and drop off lines. Parents can begin dropping off students at 8:05 a.m. and only once a staff member is out front to monitor car drop-off.

Students must be in their classrooms by 8:25 a.m. Should your child be late/tardy or returning from an appointment, you must park and escort them into the building to sign them in at the front office.

In an effort to keep our children and our school safe, you will be required to show a valid picture ID any time you pick up a student from school.

## **Volunteer Background Checks**

In an effort to keep our children and our school safe, all classroom and general field trip volunteers are required to complete a Limited Background Check prior to volunteering in the classroom or attending any field trips.

Forms can be requested from your teacher or from the office. Volunteer Limited Background Checks are free of charge to anyone interested in volunteering. Volunteer opportunities vary by teacher.

Volunteers attending overnight field trips with students must complete a more in depth background check. The fee for this is \$28.00. All volunteers would be made aware of this additional expense prior to the overnight experience.



### **Transportation**

Your bus assignment information will come in the mail to your home a few days before school begins. Should you have any questions regarding transportation, their phone number is (317)254-5510.

All students should board their bus at their assigned stop
 each day. If you move during the school year, please
 contact the office to make permanent changes to your
 transportation.

Limited Choice/Out-of-District transportation is the parent
 responsibility. Please make sure that your student(s)
 arrive at school on time in the morning and picked-up on
 time in the afternoon.

Car pick-up students will be stationed at the front of the building. Once the parent/guardian is at the front of the building, AV staff will escort students to each car. Please do not park and come into the building at dismissal.

All students must be picked-up by 3:35 p.m. or arrangements need to be arranged with AYS.

Unfortunately, we **cannot** accept transportation changes over the phone, email, or fax. Please make sure you communicate any changes with a written note to avoid any confusion at dismissal. Unless we receive written notice from the parent/guardian, your student will be sent home on their assigned bus.

Students without a written note will be sent home on their regular bus, without exception.

#### **Attendance**

**Absence is defined as a student missing all or any portion of the school day, for any reason.** There are three types of absences: Excused, Unexcused, and Prearranged (considered Excused if approved).

If your student is arriving late or leaving early for an appointment, please request a note from the dentist, doctor, etc. All notes should be given to the front office for recordkeeping. Offices may also fax notes to (317)576-5255.

#### **Excused Absence (including being tardy)**

- Death in the immediate family.
- Major religious holiday.
- Medical, dental, court or other required appointment. Must provide a signed statement from doctor, dentist, etc. upon return to school.
- Personal illness/injury. Please call the attendance line 205-3332 X11555 each day the student is absent. A written medical verification from a physician/clinic must be provided upon the student's return to school after 5 consecutive days of absence due to illness.
- A written medical verification from a physician/clinic must be provided for each additional absence once 10 days of absence (whether excused or unexcused) have been accumulated.

#### **Unexcused Absence** (including being tardy)

Absences for any reasons other than those mentioned above and/or not verified as required are considered unexcused. Missing the bus, etc., is unexcused.

#### **Prearranged Absence**

A prearranged absence request will not be approved if any one of the following occurs:

- It is the final week of any grading period.
- It is the week preceding or the week following a recess period.
- It is during required testing.
- The student has excessive absences.

Please note that the State Board of Accounts does not allow the charging of meals. All meals must be paid in advance. If a check is returned to the school for nonpayment from the bank, an additional charge of \$20.00 will be added and you must send cash or money order to cover the cost.

NOTE: Parents visiting their student for lunch may bring outside food, but please no sharing with classmates.
