Kin Education- Organ Donor Awareness



The Kin Organ Donor Awareness Campaign (Kin-ODAC) was established in 2001 at National Convention to improve Kin education on issues of concern and importance to organ donation across Canada, and then to extend that education throughout our communities.

It was the dream of [Andrew Hatfield](#), born with a complex congenital heart disease and the first Kin Kid to join the St. John's East Kinsmen Club (his father, Larry, was a life member) that inspired Kin across Canada to get involved with organ donor awareness. Through his Kin connection, Andrew felt a contribution could be made to the program that became his passion, the Organ Donor program. And while thinking out loud one day he revealed his wish to help in some way. That was the beginning of what would eventually become Kin-ODAC, passed at National Convention in Corner Brook 2001 as the first ever, national public awareness project in Kin. It has become an educational avenue for the organ donor program to work through the network of clubs that is Kin Canada.

Annually, the end of April marks National Organ and Tissue Donor Awareness Week. For Kin members, it is a time to increase awareness among ourselves about the Organ Donor program, to assist in the education of our communities, and to be a contact that the National Organ Donor Program can call upon when they need an inroad to a community where we already exist.

Partnership

This partnership with the Organ Donor Program is in fact an extension of our partnership with the Canadian Cystic Fibrosis Foundation. The network of Kinsmen and Kinettes has made great strides in their efforts against CF over the last 40 years. Kin can extend that power to help those who are awaiting transplants. Many of the young adults with CF have reached the age of adulthood due to the efforts of kin, and we can help them further by educating Kin members about the need for organ donation. CF patients and others need transplantation to live.

Organ donation can mean the difference between life and death for many people. For others it represents a total transformation in their quality of life. For example, a person with CF requiring a lung transplant needs the operation to live, while a person needing dialysis requires treatment three days a week for four hours and a kidney transplant would add improvement to their daily life.

"[Andrew Hatfield](#), who died in 2000 while waiting for a transplant, would be very proud of how Kin has responded to this effort, and if he could have seen how far his dream has come he would have said a sincere thank you to all of you. There are many 'Andrews' out there, awaiting transplants to improve, prolong and save their lives." (*Anne Marie Fleming, St. John's East Kinettes*)

Did you know that out of every million Canadians, only 15 are organ donors? It's true.

- Canada's organ donation rate ranks in the bottom half of countries in the western world where transplants are performed. More than 3,500 Canadians are waiting for an organ transplant, and every year nearly 150 of them die, waiting.
- We have some of the best transplant technology in the world, some of the most highly skilled surgeons, some of the most prestigious transplant hospitals, but there are never enough organs available to save enough lives.
- Too few Canadians decide to become potential organ and tissue donors. Too few Canadians talk about that decision with their families.

There's good news

The numbers above paint a picture that is hard to face. However, there is some good news (Health Canada 2002-02-27):

- Nearly 98% of all kidney transplants, 90% of liver transplants, and 85% of heart transplants are successful;
- More than 1,800 organ transplants were performed in Canadian hospitals in 2000;
- Donor families say they are comforted by the feeling that their loved one's death was not in vain.

This gives Canadians all the more reason to take the time to make their wishes known either by filling out their province's organ donor card or registering their wishes through a provincial registry. Many of you may have questions involving the donation of one's tissue or organs such as:

- Can I donate one organ, but not all?
- What is the success rate of transplantation?
- Is my age a factor?
- Is organ donation expensive?

Once you have found out more about organ donation, and if you decide that this is something that you would like to do then you can register through an Organ Donor Registry. To find out more about registering your consent, please contact the appropriate transplant program.

EVENT: Home Horizon Family Christmas Sponsorship

PROJECT COMPLETED: Items were delivered to Home Horizon on Tuesday, December 21st with the exception of the Good Food Box as President Michelle forgot to pick it up (sorry Kim). Also, many clothing items were delivered on December 29th as they were received and needed to be washed before delivering.

RESULTS: The club supported sponsoring the family in the amount of \$150. With this in mind, contacts were made to people involved in the "Gift of Giving" program. The Kinette request was accepted. This program gave the family 2 boxes of food which included a turkey, apple pie, bag of potatoes, canned goods, and all the necessary fixings for a Christmas turkey dinner. The program also donated 3 carry bags (2 for the little girls and 1 for the mother) full of various little gifts. In talking to various people in Michelle's office, more food and gifts were delivered to her home. A large bag of clothing was received on December 23rd and delivered on December 29th. The \$150 was spent on Christmas outfits for the 2 girls, dolls that the girls wanted, and other toys. Stuffed stockings were donated as well.

- ½ c. Plain Flour
- ¼ c. Cornmeal
- ½ c. Quick Cooking Oats
- 2/3 c. Skim Milk Powder
- ½ c. Oats
- ½ c. Whole Wheat Flour
- 1 ½ tsp Beef Bouillon



Gift in a Jar: Layer the dry ingredients, in order given, in a 1 quart jar, packing firmly.

To Use: Empty jar contents into a bowl. Cut in ½ cup of shortening, 1 egg, ¾ cup of hot water. Knead for 5 minutes. Roll 1/2" thick on floured board. Cut into bone shapes or triangles, etc. Microwave at 60% power for about 10-15 minutes rotating plate. Let cool. Store in refrigerator.

TWICE-BAKED-POTATO= FRITTERS

- 4 slices bacon, chopped
- 1 cup mashed potatoes, left over or made fresh (about 4 medium potatoes)
- 1/4 cup sour cream
- 1/2 cup grated cheese
- 1/2 bunch green onions, white part sliced
- 1 egg
- salt & pepper
- 1 cup dried potato flakes
- canola oil, for frying

Heat a large skillet over medium heat and cook the bacon until golden brown. Remove to a paper-towel lined platter to drain. In large mixing bowl, combine the cooled mashed potatoes, sour cream, cheese, onions, egg, bacon, and salt & pepper. Mix well. Pour the potato flakes into a shallow dish and place next to bowl. Drop a well-rounded tablespoonful of potato mixture into the potato flakes. Roll around in the flakes and form a 2-inch ball. The potato fritter balls may be refrigerated, covered for up to 2 days. In a medium pot, heat a few inches of frying oil over medium-high heat. When the oil is ready, bubbles will stream rapidly away from the handle of a wooden spoon inserted in the oil. If you have a kitchen thermometer, 350°F is the ideal temperature. Fry the potato balls a few at a time, making sure not to crowd the pot, 4-5 minutes or until golden brown. Drain on a cooling rack over a paper-towel-lined baking sheet. Repeat until all the potato balls are fried. Serve hot with sour cream. Can make smaller for appetizers.

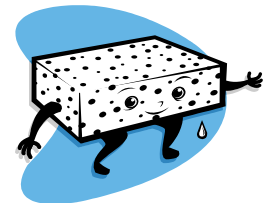

Kevin was inspirational to many people across Canada and into the United States of America, as he shared his talents and his message of hope. As people continue all these years later to share their stories of how Kevin changed their lives and inspired them, I decided it was time to unite as we continue with his dream as he wanted us to do.

This gala is a time to Celebrate Friendship, Faith, and Hope which were all so important to Kevin. As we head in the direction of finding a cure for CF, we shall remember his legacy and life which brought us all together with this common goal.

ABOUT KEVIN DENBOK

Kevin Gys DenBok was born on December 4, 1964 in Collingwood, Ontario to Gys and Marie den Bok. Diagnosed with cystic fibrosis (CF) at the age of 3. Although Kevin was born with this genetic disease, it took several years to make a diagnosis that most in the medical profession were unfamiliar with. Kevin's childhood he would appear to be a healthy and happy young boy, however, he required treatments for his CF. This included taking up to 100 pills a day to help keep him that healthy. Many days of his childhood in and out of hospitals, mostly at the Sick Kids Hospital in Toronto.

At the age of 7 Kevin performed in his first talent contest. He received a gold medal for his performance of the song "I Wonder What I Will Be When I Grow Up Someday". Kevin later went on to perform at men and Kinette functions throughout Ontario starting at the age of 10. Kevin won several other awards for his singing talents and at the age of 14 the Kinsmen made his dream come true as they financed his first recording.



He was diagnosed with CF at the age of 3. Throughout his childhood, Kevin spent

many years in hospital. He performed in many Kinsmen competitions and recorded his first

With Kevin's singing & songwriting talents, he raised over one million dollars for Cystic Fibrosis research with the help of Kinsmen and Kinettes across Canada. He recorded 3 LPs and several 45 records. Kevin sang with Celine Dion in 1982 and worked with Paul Shaffer on his last album in 1986 to name a few of his successes. In the early 1980's Kevin DenBok was a household name as he topped the music charts with hits such as "Tonight". He travelled across Canada several times, performing at many schools and fundraisers, donating all proceeds to CF. In 1983 Kevin was one of the first to receive the Order of Collingwood for making contributions to the improvement of social, cultural and recreation conditions in Collingwood, Ontario. In that same year he received the Ontario Medal of Good Citizenship. Recipients of this are recognized for outstanding achievement, as their lives serve as an example to all Ontarians. They are individuals who have made their communities better places to live. Today Kevin is remembered for his contributions and achievements through various awards and bursaries across Canada in his name. At the age of 17, Kevin became the first Honorary Kinsmen in Canada. Kevin loved the Kinsmen and Kinettes and many of them were like family to him.



Kevin received many keys to cities across Canada during his travels and he was always very proud to say he was Canadian. He performed on national TV shows such as "Thrill of a Life Time" and did numerous radio interviews across Canada. He travelled to Los Angeles, California twice in hopes to have his musical talents recognized there. He met Joan Rivers, Scott Baio, and Robert Urich on his journeys, which he was very proud of. He had a dream to someday to tour with his band across the USA to raise money for CF. The map he drew out of his dream spelled CF from coast to coast. He was very imaginative and creative and was determined to do everything he could to raise money for CF in the short amount of time he knew he had left.

Kevin's passed away at the age of 21, on November 24, 1986. At the time of his passing, the life expectancy for an individual with CF was 21. Although Kevin's life was short, he lived it to the fullest, and always believed in quality over quantity. With his faith and hope, he remained strong and optimistic as he battled the disease that eventually would take his life. What made Kevin unique is that he never made it about him, it was always about doing it for others with CF, and thanking 'People Like You'. He used his talents to bring awareness of CF to people across Canada and into the USA. He was determined to find a cure for CF and even up to his time of death asked that we continue in the fight until a cure is found.

It is thanks to people like Kevin, Kinsmen & Kinettes, and anyone supporting this important cause, that the life expectancy has doubled over the past 25 years. With the funds raised for research, medical advancements have been made to allow individuals with CF to have a brighter future.

Kevin would be honoured know that after 25 years he is still remembered and his legacy still lives on. He would be proud to have known how many lives he had touched and that we are continuing with his dream to find a cure for CF. He wanted that more than anything. We will always remember his warm smile, great sense of humour, big heart, his love for life, and his dreams. As we gather together at the "Just Breathe" Gala for Cystic Fibrosis in Kevin's Memory we will work towards making his dream come true as we head towards finding a cure.

CF News.. Candid Facts

Eva Markvoort, 25, lost her battle with cystic fibrosis in March, but the legacy she's left behind has made an immeasurable impact in Canada, and around the world. Eva inspired many with her endless love and joy, even while facing death. Never one to be a passive bystander to her illness, she was a subject of the critically acclaimed Canadian documentary, *65_RedRoses*. Her popular blog gave readers a touchingly frank look into the last few months of her life. In February, Eva received the Foundation's prestigious Summerhayes Award for her outstanding work with the CCFF.

“A mark on the world, a difference, some proof that I had been here, something to say that I mattered, that when my body left this world my soul had made its imprint.” — *Eva Dien Brine Markvoort 1984-2010*

After she passed, 65 of Canada's leading artists – including Robert Bateman, Robert Genn, Michael Svob and Angela Au Hemphill – each contributed an 8 x 10" wooden tile with the artist's interpretation of a single red rose as a tribute to Eva. The tiles were then assembled into a marvelous bouquet of delicate, elegant, whimsical and quirky roses. The project is the brainchild of

Angela Au Hemphill, a highly accomplished artist and an old friend of the Markvoort family. This one-of-a-kind art project called 65 Red Roses has been donated by the Federation of Canadian Artists to the Vancouver/Lower Mainland Chapter of the Canadian Cystic Fibrosis Foundation to use as a fundraising tool to help find a cure for cystic fibrosis. The painting is now prominently displayed at the BC Children's Hospital (BCCH), a place Eva and her family knew all too well. We spent countless hours at BC Children's Hospital during her younger years, and one of our favourite activities was to roam the halls with Eva to look at all the artwork on the walls," said Eva's parents, Janet Brine and Bill Markvoort. "It warms our hearts to know that the painting has found a home at BCCH, and that it will bring joy to the challenging times children and their families may

spend there." Over the past six months, those touched by Eva have raised more than \$125,000, through donations and various fundraising projects, including the 65 Red Roses painting, the Reddy for a Cure Campaign, the Edward Chapman WOMAN/Circa Ici 65 Red Roses Passion for Fashion fundraising initiative, and the Tandem Tour bike ride across Canada. It's that time of year again; students are heading off to post-secondary school and need as much help as possible. In memory of the Association's founder, Hal Rogers, Kin Canada has established the Kin Canada Bursaries, a program of the Hal Rogers Endowment Fund. Its purpose is to promote, encourage and sponsor educational programs and activities. Through the Kin Canada Bursary, students can apply to receive \$1000 towards their education.

TOTAL: \$12,144.00



WOW! Can you believe that? And remember, this is for college, add a few more thousand on there if you plan on attending university. When thinking about giving students the opportunity to receive \$1000, it seems like a lot of money to give away, but really in the grand scheme of things, this covers the cost of books – something that is required for courses. Or, this covers just over a month of sleeping, or half a year of food. BUT did you know that for some students, this \$1000 could make or break their college career? Some students rely so heavily on OSAP or student bursaries that without them they may never attend college.

When February 1st rolls around, and we have submissions for the Kin Canada Bursary, just remember how much this money could impact someone's life. As a Kinette club who donates to the HREF (Hal Rogers Endowment Fund), we can be proud to have helped many students' head off onto a new phase of their lives.

Hal Rogers believed in the value of education. In his own words, "providing and promoting the finest and most effective education possible for our young people" was a noble endeavour.

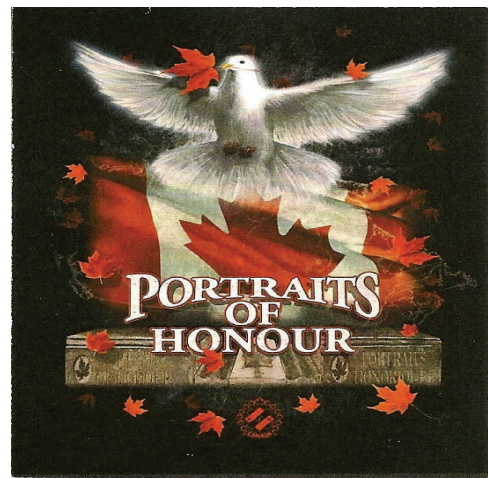

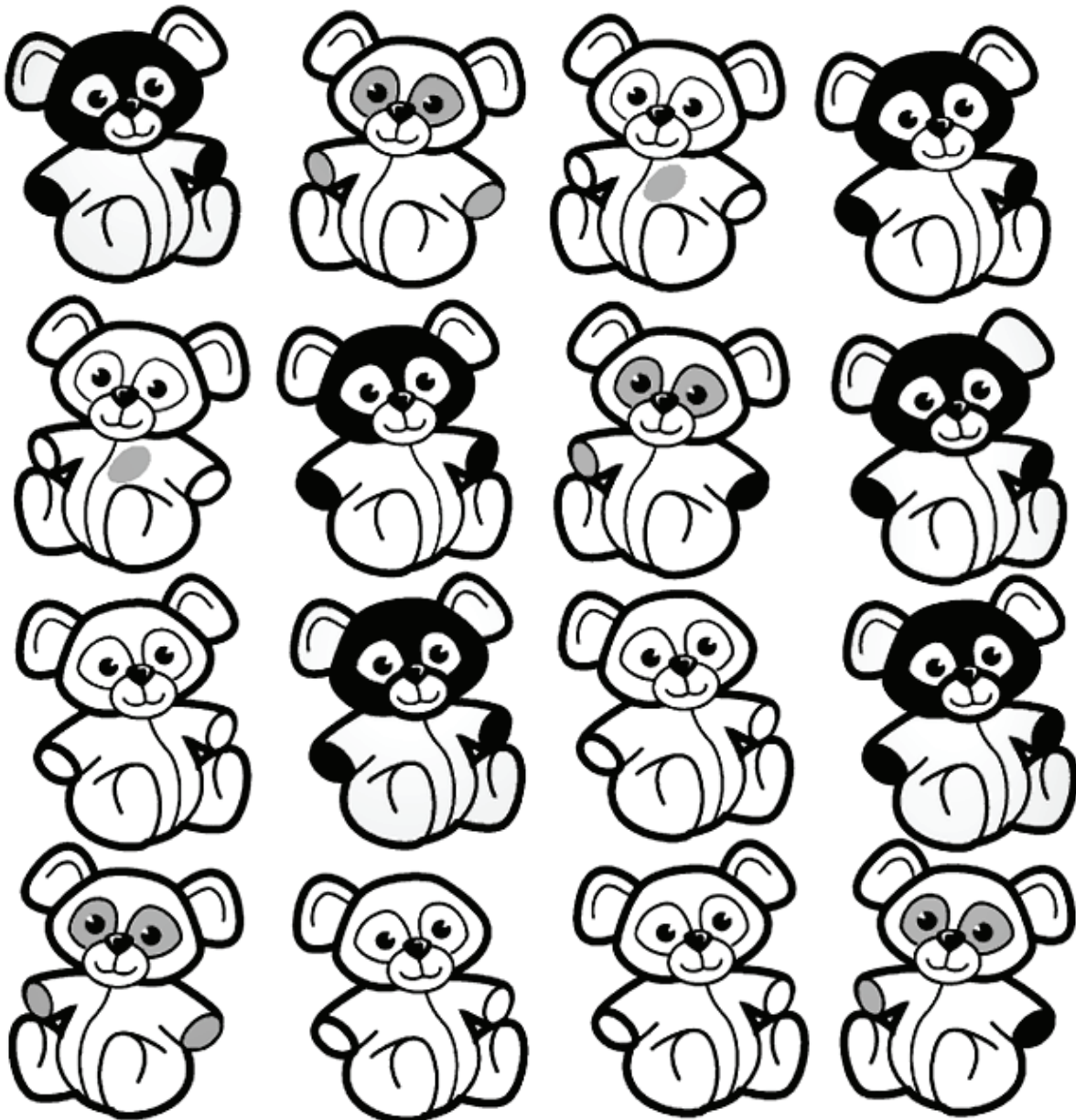


