SECTION A – ASSIGNMENT DESCRIPTION

A.1 About HEQCO

The Higher Education Quality Council of Ontario (HEQCO) is an independent agency of the Government of Ontario that conducts research and provides objective advice to government to improve the accessibility, quality and accountability of Ontario's public colleges and universities. HEQCO employs a multifaceted research approach to inform the implementation of meaningful policies that improve postsecondary education in Ontario, Canada and around the world.

A. 2 Description of Assignment

Defining what students should know and be able to do upon completion of their postsecondary programs of study, and constructing reliable and valid methods for measuring these desired learning outcomes are two of the most significant challenges in PSE today. HEQCO has conducted work on these issues for the past four years.

Three years ago, as part of its focus on learning outcomes assessment, HEQCO created a <u>Learning</u> <u>Outcome Assessment Consortium (LOAC)</u>. Institutions that are part of the consortium are developing and piloting tools and techniques that assess students' <u>higher-order cognitive skills</u>, such as critical thinking and communication. While current members of LOAC continue to develop their assessment tools and techniques, this RFP is a call for a second round of applications from colleges and universities that wish to join and contribute to the consortium.

Background

Different strategies have been used in different jurisdictions to assess learning outcomes. In 2006 the OECD initiated the Assessment of Higher Education Learning Outcomes (AHELO) study to determine the feasibility of measuring learning outcomes in different countries. Many countries, including the United States, are also engaged in 'Tuning' projects that work with faculty to articulate learning outcomes in specific disciplines, groupings of disciplines or degrees. There has also been considerable work done to design tests, like the Collegiate Learning Assessment (CLA), that seek to measure specific learning outcomes.

Over the last four years, HEQCO has supported a host of projects to explore the feasibility, challenges and constraints of incorporating better measurement of learning outcomes into Ontario's PSE system. These projects include: creating a Learning Outcomes Assessment Practitioner's Handbook; conducting an environmental scan and review of the literature on the shift to competency-based education; leading the Ontario involvement in the civil engineering strand of AHELO; working with Ontario college and university faculty to articulate learning outcomes in the physical sciences, social sciences, and life and health sciences sectors; pilot projects examining the feasibility of using the Collegiate Learning Assessment tool; and the evaluation of a host of innovative interventions to promote better and more effective learning in large classes or through the use of technology.

In response to the need for more reliable and valid methods of assessing students' achievement of learning outcomes, HEQCO created in December 2012 a consortium of <u>six postsecondary institutions</u> that were prepared to commit themselves to the task of assessing higher-order cognitive, skills such as critical thinking and communication. Institutions participating in the consortium are developing and piloting different techniques to measure student competencies and skills, ranging from ePortfolios to the development of analytic rubrics, and then testing whether these techniques are valid, reliable and ultimately scalable to the institution level.

The purpose of this RFP is to select additional institutions to join the Learning Outcomes Assessment Consortium (LOAC) to further the discussion about developing and implementing learning outcomes assessments. Specifically, we seek institutions that are prepared to:

- 1. Commit to a multi-year project developing, validating and implementing assessment tools to measure higher-order cognitive skills in their institutions;
- 2. Commit to sharing best practices with other members of the consortium and to the broader community through a yearly deliverable; and
- 3. Participate actively in various knowledge mobilization strategies, such as presenting at conferences, participating on webinars or writing blog posts, to share their approaches and learnings with other members of the consortium, as well as the broader postsecondary community.

We do not expect all member institutions of the consortium to approach learning outcome measurement and implementation in the same way. In fact, we believe that a diversity of approaches

will serve the sector best. We appreciate that institutions may choose to develop and refine their assessment tools when working with specific populations of students. However, to be successful in this competition, institutions are expected to commit to using their assessment tools with the widest possible set of students in their institution. Institutions will also be expected to have a senior administrator sign off on these commitments and to designate an appropriate high-level administrator as the person responsible for this initiative and as the liaison to the consortium and HEQCO for this project.

In addition, institutions wishing to be considered for this RFP are asked to:

- Describe their intended approach for the development and implementation of learning outcomes assessments. This description should include: What higher-order cognitive skills will you measure (Do you have your own list? Will you use skill sets developed by others, such as HEQCO's Tuning project, LEAP, etc.)? Which student populations do you intend to use initially to develop your assessment tools? What is your time frame for the development and testing of your assessment tool and when will this tool be extended institution-wide? (HEQCO would be expecting no more than a three-year period from the initiation of the project).
- 2. Describe the dissemination strategy that they plan to use to share the results of their research. Please be as specific as possible, listing the avenues you will use, the communities you hope to target and the impact you hope your research will have. As a government agency, HEQCO supports research that will impact discussions of Ontario's policy priorities or business/educational practices within a range of different communities, including policy makers, academia and the public.
- 3. Identify their real and in-kind contribution to this project, both of which are expected. The demonstrated approval and support of the institution's senior administrators is essential to ensuring the ongoing health and productivity of the consortium.

HEQCO will provide successful institutions with an immediate seed grant of \$10,000 for this project. In successive years, we are also prepared to provide additional funding based on the budget submitted by the institution in their application. HEQCO will also support and cover all administrative and meeting costs for the consortium. It is also expected that institutions provide a yearly progress report summarizing their work and lessons learned that will be disseminated within the broader community.
