First Paragraph: Open strongly, identifying your unique experience that will set you apart from other candidates. Identify the position you are applying for, and name drop if appropriate. If you are not applying through OCR, mention where you saw the job posting.

Throughout, use words and phrases from the job posting as much as possible. These key words are highlighted in this example so you can see how they are used. This letter is in response to a real Amazon job posting.

Second paragraph: Build on key accomplishments that directly address their requirements as stated in the job posting.

Third (and fourth if needed) paragraphs: Close strongly with more relevant skills, and letting them know how much you want to work for them – that you know the company well from your research - and what you can do for them. Thank them!
