PUT THE CURSOR AFTER THE LAST THING THAT YOU TYPED ON THE LAST PAGE.

Press **ENTER** (on the number pad) **ONE TIME** 

**CENTER Works Cited Return one time** (You should have DS set)

- Left align, Drag your lower ruler (the big one) to 1 1/2 inches. Begin typing your **Works**Cited information for your first resource. Your first line of information will NOT be indented, the second, third, and other lines of information will be indented.
- Return type your **next resource**. Just like the first resource, the first line is NOT indented but the second, third and other lines of information will be indented.

## **Rules for Citing Resources**

#### THE BASIC ENTRY

#### Structure:

Author's Name. Title of the book. Publication information.

### **Example:**

Gibaldi, Joseph. <u>MLA Handbook for Writers of Research Papers</u>. 5th ed. New York: Modern Language Association, 2002.

This entry states that the work's author is Joseph Gibaldi and its title is *MLA Handbook for Writers of Research Papers 5th Edition*. The remaining information relates, in shortened form, that the work was published in New York by the Modern Language Association in 2002.

#### **AN ANONYMOUS BOOK**

#### Structure:

Title of the book. Publication information.

## **Example:**

Encyclopedia of Virginia. New York: Somerset, 1993.

### **WORLD WIDE WEB**

#### **Structure:**

Author or originator. Title of item. Date of document or download (day, month, year). URL <a href="http://address/filename">http://address/filename</a>.

## **Example:**
