Council celebrates National Apprenticeship WeekSarah Hinks

Helping young people to gain vital training and earn a wage at the same time, apprenticeships are gaining popularity as a viable alternative to university. As an advocate and employer of apprentices, the County Council held a range of events from 3 - 8 March to celebrate National Apprenticeship Week.

- Brief Bite sessions for managers on recruiting and supporting apprentices were held providing information on how teams can offer a range of opportunities for young people.
- A Build East Sussex event held on Tuesday 4 March at the Amex stadium was an opportunity to promote and encourage our contractors and suppliers to develop opportunities for young people and those from vulnerable groups, in the construction sector including through the use of the Training Apprenticeships in Construction (TrAC) scheme.
- On Wednesday 5 March, the Lead Member for Learning and Schools Effectiveness, Councillor Bennett, job-shadowed a civil engineering apprentice Peter Sutton, who is currently working on the Bexhill to Hastings link road project.
- To end the week, the Business Services Directorate held an Apprenticeship Open Day on Thursday 6 March, to help people find out more about becoming an apprentice at the Council, specialising in finance, ICT, personnel, property and procurement. The Open Day offered the inside track on what being an apprentice is really like, with staff on hand from each service area to talk about the sort of work apprentices could expect to do and how to apply for the new pilot programme.

The Youth Employability Service (YES) was on hand at all the events to provide the opportunity for young people to sign up for further support in obtaining a successful apprenticeship. GOALS

We are piloting a new programme which focuses on changing the mindset and attitudes of some of our most disadvantaged and hardest to reach young people. The programme aims to help young people to reach a point where they are ready to move on and progress positively with their lives; and ultimately motivating them to move into sustainable education, employment and training. GOALS has been chosen following six months of research into good practice in this area nationally, the model is based on training staff locally to deliver the programme so that it is sustainable in the longer term.

Following discussions with a range of colleagues across the Council we have commissioned GOALS UK to pilot a series of multiagency staff training sessions and to deliver the 3 days GOALS motivational programme to some of our disengaged young people in East Sussex.

The programme aims to help those young people who are not sure about their future, by providing the stepping stones to get them ready to start work or enter further education. National Citizen Service

The National Citizen Service (NCS) is the Government's flagship personal and social development programme for young people. NCS is promoted as a once in a lifetime opportunity, open to all 16-17 olds in years 11 and 12, from all schools and colleges including state funded, special and independent and those 16 & 17 year olds who are currently not in education, employment training or training. NCS is a 4 week programme delivered over the summer holidays, young people get the opportunity to take part in two challenging residentials and deliver a social action project in their local community. In the summer 2014 East Sussex



local deliver partners are:

- Catch 22 (Eastbourne, Seaford and Lewes Areas)
 Start dates; 7th July or 14th August
- Hastings YMCA (Hastings, St Leonards on Sea and Bexhill areas)
 Start dates; 14th July
- CXK (Heathfield, Rye and Robertsbridge areas)
 Start dates: 18th July, 22nd July, 26th July and 30th July

The NCS team are happy to come and present to groups of young people in schools, colleges, youth centres and community settings and/or meet with young people individually to discuss the programme in more detail. Youth Employability Service – Support available Robert Moore

'YES' our new Youth Employability Service in East Sussex has been running since 1st October 2013, delivering a targeted Information, Advice and Guidance (IAG) Support Service for 16-18 year olds. YES provide IAG support to vulnerable 16-18 year olds who are not in education, employment or training or at risk of disengaging to help them participate successfully in education and progress to employment. The support provided includes: one-to-one support for young people, group sessions and re-engagement programmes. The YES offices in Eastbourne and Hastings are both fully operational and their outreach sessions in different venues across the county are now underway.

Schools and colleges are encouraged to start considering which Year 11 and Year 12 learners they feel would benefit from a referral to YES to enable successful progression to post-16 learning. Once a referral is made YES will be able to provide support leading up to, and over, the summer. To make a referral, or for more information please contact YES directly:

UCAS Progress – Course Finder Update

The UCAS Progress website is currently showing a wide range of 2014/15 courses provided by colleges, school sixth forms and training providers in East Sussex and our neighbouring authorities. Over 80% of all FE colleges and school sixth forms in East Sussex and Brighton



and Hove have now signed up to display their provision on UCAS Progress as well as Central Sussex College and almost all colleges and school sixth forms in Kent. Learners can search using course name, provider name and by location/distance to travel. The UCAS Progress website can be viewed on the following link: https://www.ucasprogress.com/

The model of an on-line course finder was recently endorsed in a speech made by the Deputy Prime Minister, Nick Clegg who announced in a recent speech that local authorities will be: 'responsible for providing a 'UCAS-style one stop online shop' for young people..... to help young people make choices about the training, apprenticeships, courses or other work-based programmes available in their area. This will allow people to more easily find out about and apply for all the options available to them in their local area'.

UCAS Progress fits in with this proposal and we await more details on how a national model will be rolled out including an on-line application system.

Do we need a website for young people in East Sussex? Robert Moore

The team is currently reviewing how we provide information on education/training and related support to young people, parents/carers and professionals in East Sussex and asking the question whether there is demand for a dedicated young person's website in East Sussex.

<u>Connexions360</u> currently provides information on education, employment and training opportunities across the county, along with advice and guidance on a whole range of issues affecting young people.

Data on learner destinations

Each year we publish information on the intended destinations, September Guarantee offers and final destinations of Year 11 leavers (known as the Annual Activity Survey). In 2013 95% of Year 11 leavers went onto education or training, of which 75% went onto a college, 16% stayed on at a school sixth form and 1% onto an apprenticeship.
