Entries that are not properly certified by the school principal or received by the deadline will not be accepted.

Entries are limited to one per person; however, the number of entries per school is unlimited.

Submission materials become the property of VHSL and will not be returned.

**DEADLINES:** April 20, 2012

**WINNERS:** Winner(s) will be unveiled at the Student Leaders Conference, April 27-28, 2012 at Clover Hill High School. Winning design(s) will be printed on the front of all state championship t-shirts during the 2012-13 school year and winner will receive one free t-shirt. Design may also be used as a logo for stationery, banners or other print material to commemorate and brand the centennial celebration.
