
# Notes from the Main Office...

Messages for Students, Phone Calls, & Cell Phones...What's the Policy?

Parents, please be aware that messages left for students <u>are not guaranteed to reach your child</u>. Students are only called into the office during announcements which are made 4th and 8th hour, unless it is an emergency. Students also will not be pulled from class unless there is an emergency. Please keep this in mind when leaving messages for your child or dropping off homework, personal items, etc.

Students <u>will not be allowed</u> to use office phones unless there is an emergency. There is a payphone for student use. Students may also ask a friend to borrow a cell phone if it does not interfere with the friend missing class time. Please do not expect the office staff to allow your child to use the phone.

Cell phones are allowed to be used appropriately before/after school and during lunch/passing times. Teachers have individual rules regarding cell phones in their classrooms, and also have the authority to confiscate phones when needed. Please refrain from texting your child during class time.







#### **BUS PASSES**

At 3:10.....

Student: "I need a bus pass."

Office: "Do you have a note from a parent?"

Student: "Uhhhh....."

Who needs a bus pass?

-students who do not usually ride a bus -students who are riding a different bus than normal

How does a student get a bus pass?

-the student needs written permission from a parent stating what bus he/she will be riding, who he/she will be riding with or why he/she needs to ride the bus (if he/she doesn't usually ride)—parents may also call to give permission

-the student brings the permission note into the office or the bus garage (258-4155). main office and a bus pass is written out

Students must give their pass to the bus driver.

Students should get their bus passes before 3:15 to ensure they will make it on their bus. Late requests will not be granted.

Calls may be made to parents to verify permission.

If you have any questions, call the main office or the bus garage (258-4155).

# Parking Permits...Everybody Needs 'em!!!

All students who use the parking lot at school are required to purchase a parking permit for \$1 in the main office. This includes students who may not park every day or who start parking half way through the year. A new permit needs to be purchased every year. Last year's red, white and blue permits are no longer valid!

All students are required to park in the student parking lot which is located on the King Rd. side of school. Students arriving after 8:10 should park in the blue lines on the highway side of the school. No student should park in the staff or visitor parking spaces. Students failing to follow the parking guidelines will be warned and could have their parking privileges taken away.

As winter approaches, that means some students will choose to ride their snowmobile to school. Snowmobiles also need to be registered in the main office under a current permit or by purchasing a new parking permit!



Snowmobile riders need to follow the same rules designated for vehicles or privileges will be taken away!

The price of the yearbook is \$55 dollars until the October 30. Personalization is extra. After that the price increases to \$60 per copy. Each senior may submit a senior photo for the book. If no picture is submitted, then the school ID photo will be used. Here are the guidelines for submitting a senior portrait:

- 1. Due by the end of October for best results. Photos submitted after November 13<sup>th</sup> cannot be guaranteed in the publication.
- 2. Head and shoulder shots. No full body shots which means no knees, hips or reclining positions.
- 3. No hats, props or animals.
- 4. If the clothes are not school appropriate, then the clothes are not yearbook appropriate (no references to drugs, alcohol, etc.)
- 5. Color photos only. No Black and White or Sepia tones.
- 6. Submit the photos electronically if possible in highest resolution as possible and large size. We will crop the pictures to a vertical format.
- 7. Cell phone selfies are not allowed.

If the photo does not conform to the guidelines, your school ID picture will be used.





#### The following are commonly asked questions about work permits

Q: What information is needed to obtain a permit?

**One** of the following forms of proof of age: Birth Certificate, Baptismal Certificate, valid WI license/WI photo ID. **Temps** are now accepted.

Original Social Security Card or *letter* from Social Security Administration.

Letter from employer with name of business, address, phone number, position hired for and duties that minor will be performing.

Note from parent giving student permission to work at specific place (must include job responsibilities)

**\$10 fee** (must be reimbursed by employer)

Q: Do students need to get a permit before they get a job and at what age can they get/need a permit?

A: Permits are not obtained until after a student has been hired. They need to be 14 years old and need a permit until they reach the age of 18.

Q: Do students need to obtain a permit for every place of employment and do the permits expire?

A: Yes, students need a permit for each employer.

Q: Does the parent or the student sign the permit?

A: The student must sign the permit.

Q: Can copies of the documents (SS card, birth/baptismal certificate) be used?

A: No, you must have originals to obtain a permit. If you are unable to find your originals then you must obtain new ones. A stamped letter proving that you applied for a new card can be used in place of the SS card.

Q: Do work permits expire?

A: If minors are returning to a job they held last summer, they <u>may not</u> need a new work permit. If the employer let them go last year <u>with</u> a promise of work in the following summer, they <u>DO NOT</u> need a new permit. However if the employer clearly ended the work relationship at the end of last summer and the minor had to reapply for work, this is a new work relationship and a new work permit is needed.

The number to call during school days (7:30-3:30) is 258-4131.

Once you have your letter of hire gather your needed documents and bring them to Mrs. Ikert or Mrs. TeBeest at the high school, or call for an appointment. Other schools also have permit officers that can assist you. You <u>must</u> have all required documents.
