What is the Youth Justice Board?

The Youth Justice Board helps teens speak to New York City leaders about issues that matter to them!

The Youth Justice Board is a diverse group of New York City teens who work to make the city better for their peers. Board members investigate an issue that affects their lives, come up with ideas about how to make things better, and then help turn these ideas into reality. Through this process, members develop critical thinking, leadership and public speaking skills that will benefit them now and in their futures. The program meets at the Center for Court Innovation in midtown Manhattan.

What will I do?

In 2012-13, the Board will study school truancy.

School truancy is a risk-factor for both dropping out of school and becoming involved in the justice system. Yet 34% of high school students in New York City miss at least one month of school each year. The Youth Justice Board will work to reduce rates of truancy and help teens who are affected by this issue.

Truancy is a challenge that adult policymakers have struggled to address and they are eager to hear young people's input. Board members will interview experts on school truancy, conduct focus groups with young people, and analyze their own experiences to learn about this issue. At the end of the year, Board members will publish a report containing their ideas about how to address this problem. Members will present their recommendations to policymakers and other city stakeholders.





If you want to apply...

- You must be 14-18 years old by August 28, 2012. (If you are under 18 years old, you will need your parent or guardian's permission to join).
- You must be allowed to work in the United States (if you have a Social Security Number, you are allowed).
- You must be able to go on an overnight retreat on September 7-9, 2012 (all expenses will be covered by the program).
- You must be able to attend meetings every Tuesday and Thursday from August 28, 2012—June 6, 2013. There will also be 4-5 longer workshops on weekends and school

We have two deadlines this year. Our priority deadline is Friday, June 22, 2012, and the final deadline is July 12, 2012. You can mail, fax, or email the application, or complete it online.
