Celebrate Family Literacy on January 27. Visit a library with your students. The Vancouver Public Library now has a service for newcomers called "Fiction for Newcomers". Your learners can fill in a form here: http://guides.vpl.ca/ fictionfornewcomers.

Learners can ask a librarian to help them find books that are fun and that will help them improve their English reading skills.

New Year's resolutions

You may want to take a few minutes to discuss New Year's resolutions with your students. Explain that resolutions are a tradition in which a person makes a promise to better him or herself and/or to do something nice for people, such as opening the door for them (WCR, p. 3).

What are the top resolutions in your class? Collect students' answers. Then write the top ten on the board.




