## Chairman's report April 2015

The Council has focused on achieving its objectives as set out in the 2014-15 action plan but also has endeavoured to investigate and pursue concerns raised by villagers. Once again I wish to pay tribute to all fellow Councillors who have given their time enthusiastically and generously for the benefit of our community. The Council is represented on the management committee of the Recreation Centre, Safer Neighbourhood, SDDC Area Liaison, SAVE, Aston Welfare Trust, Neighbourhood Watch, Memorial Hall, Community Group, Alvaston Medical Practice, Gravel Extraction, Donington Park Race Track and at various briefings and training courses.

I wish to thank our three employees for their hard work and loyalty; our lengthsman for keeping our village tidy and maintaining our VAS (vehicle activating sign); our gardener who looks after the village green and floral planters and to our clerk/finance officer for keeping us on track and for setting up our facebook page so enabling us to communicate regularly and more effectively. Thanks also go to our County and District Councillors who have kept us informed and supported us on issues raised by councillors and by members of the community.

The District Council invites us to comment on planned extensions to dwellings and housing developments. We welcomed the commencement of the Richmond Villages retirement village; at last we have witnessed the clearing of the troublesome redundant, vandalised hospital site. Despite a concerted effort with Weston parish council, SAVE, our County Councillor and many villagers, we lost the battle to prevent the disproportionately sized housing development on the same site. We have similarly objected to the proposed crematorium but await our opportunity to further our views once the delayed planning meeting is arranged.

We achieved our objective of enhancing the village centre by installing floral tubs and further seating. Further installations are planned for this summer. Our financial contributions and support for the Aston Playground Project, together with grant funding, enabled the official opening in late summer. Yet again, we salute the tenacity and hard work of the APP committee in seeing the playground in use. We are now working together to purchase one final piece of apparatus. Again, a full programme of weekly summer holiday activities were provided for our youngsters with attendance figures being high once more. Salsbury Plain (the playing field extension) is being well used; The Pod continues to be a meeting place and, pleasingly, there have been few anti-social behaviour incidents within the village. Thank you young people!

The warm, wet summer placed additional demands on our grass cutting budget so requests for additional cuts could not always be met and justified. We are still maintaining three burial grounds but due to the foresight of previous councillors our Derby Road Cemetery is providing an unexpected income as burial plots in other areas are declining rapidly. Improvements to this cemetery are a priority for 2015-16 with, hopefully a "Remembrance Row" of trees honouring the fallen of the two world wars and improved parking spaces.

This Council endeavours to seek best value for money. The loan for Salsbury Plain has been paid off but the first increase in the precept for a number of years will enable us to maintain our purchasing power and cover the unexpected repairs and maintenance of our legal obligations and responsibilities. Small donations were made to facilitate the well dressing festival from which so many village groups and organisations benefit, to the Aston & Weston branch of the Royal British Legion who skilfully organise our civic parade and to the organisers of the excellent World War One exhibition held in the autumn.

This is the first year of our "Excellence in the Community" award and nominees were of a high standard. This Council believes it important to recognise the outstanding work and extraordinary achievement of individuals and groups within our community. The panel met in February to select the winner from five worthy nominations. It was decided to award the first Excellence in the Community to Mr Bob Read and Mr John Holloway. Both have greatly contributed to the community life of our village, but the award was given mainly for their joint leadership, research and organisation of the excellent World War 1 exhibition last September. The Parish Council looks forward to many more nominations for "Excellence in the Community 2016 with the closing date being December 31st 2015.

In conclusion, this Council completes its term of office at the end of April. Our team of councillors wish to serve your community, bringing experience, expertise, skill and with integrity, for a further four years. I sincerely hope they have the opportunity to do so.

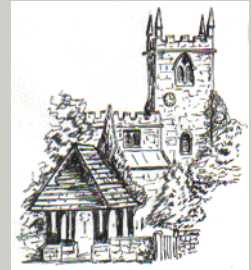

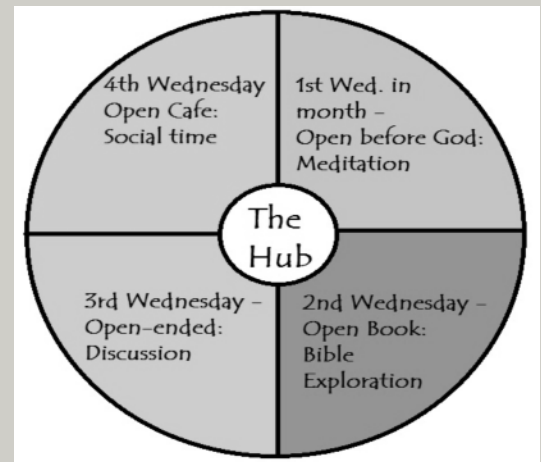

## ASTON ON TRENT PRIMARY SCHOOL

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The good work of Aston on Trent Primary School has come to the attention of the powers in Westminster, and in particular the Minister of State for Schools, the Rt Hon David Laws MP. In a letter to Mrs Kalirai, Headteacher, he congratulated the school on the improvement in the KS2 results for disadvantaged pupils. He also praised the school for its ability to boost the learning opportunities it continues to offer to disadvantaged pupils. This letter is a significant honour for the School, and Mrs Kalirai stated that the staff and all of the pupils, as well as the parents and governors, should be immensely proud of this accolade. Also, as we come to the end of yet another busy Spring Term, we would like to thank all parents, staff and pupils for their hard work in accomplishing so much. In March we celebrated World Book Day, when pupils and staff dressed up as their favourite book character. A week later the pupils and staff donned funny faces and masks to raise money for Comic Relief. Also in March, a group of Year 6 children took part in the 'Celebration of Dance' at the Assembly Rooms, performing to music from "Grease". A group of children from Year 4 have also represented the School in competitions including benchball, hockey and dodgeball, playing against local schools. Each team worked hard before competing in the individual competitions. What talented pupils we have! Finally, a theatre company presented an Anti-Bullying performance, 'Sticks and Stones' to the pupils in Years 2-6. It was thought provoking and raised many issues relating to anti-bullying, such as cyber bullying and both physical and emotional bullying. The Theatre Company commented on the pupils' knowledge and understanding of the wide range of concepts covered in the play.

This is a lengthy process in order to prepare the soil so that seeds will germinate and flourish, so don't expect a mass carpet of colour for a while yet but the work is part of the 10 year Site Management Plan we're beginning to pull together.

The latest project was to honour two soldiers from Weston who died just after the end of the first world war as a result of injuries sustained whilst fighting for their country. These two soldiers had no known graves in Weston Church so we decided to do something about it. We approached Horobin and Sons, stonemasons of Spondon and as a result a marble stone was cut and inscribed with the names of both soldiers, 2nd Lt. Reginald Walter Cartlidge and Pte. John William Walker on the stone, which was dedicated on the 11th March. We are indebted to Horobins who carried out the work free of charge but after consulting with them it was decided, at their request, we make a suitable donation to the RBL and SSAFA which was made from the Aston & Weston Veterans Trust.

This year on the 8th May marks the 70th anniversary of the end of the second world war in Europe and to mark the occasion we will be actively supporting the White Hart pub who are preparing a programme of events to celebrate the occasion. Final details have not yet been made but it is hoped the two schools of Aston & Weston will be involved together with a Brass Band and other forms of entertainment. We will also be hoping for some fine weather!

## Communication.

We are particularly keen to improve the way we communicate with members. We are now using digital media in an improved, timely way but if you have any suggestion then please give me a ring.

## Crime Prevention materials:

Through our contacts at the Derby and District Neighbourhood Watch office we can access various discounted rates for crime prevention materials. Property marking kits, including for those expensive cycles, Smart Water products and other preventative materials are available. Give us a call and we will enquire for you. Such items are no longer routinely kept by local 'Watches' as they go out of date and are rarely used but we do know how to get them if you need them.

## Anti-Social Behaviour

In the early hours of Saturday 21st March some kind people decided to throw eggs and b-b-q sauce over houses and cars on Willow Park Way/Maple Drive and Yates Avenue. They also 'attacked' the bowls club and overturned planters on their route. I am sure somebody must know who was responsible, after all I am sure it was a 'laugh' and merited some social media exposure.....if you know anything please tell us or the local Beat Team. Also groups far too old to be using the new play area are beginning to use it inappropriately. As the nights get lighter and warmer perhaps this sort of behaviour will increase, we hope not but help us 'nip' it in the bud.

## Internet safety

Place your children's computers where you can see them, where possible in communal rooms. Always know what they're doing and who they're talking to. Explain to them that not everyone online tells the truth and they should never meet strangers without a known adult present. For more on keeping children safe online, visit the **CEOP** website or **Get Safe Online**. Teach your children the **Click Code: Zip it** (keep personal information private), **Block it** (block disturbing messages), **Flag it** (report anything worrying to you).

Change your passwords regularly, and make sure to have a strong password by using a combination of numbers, symbols and upper and lower case letters.

Make sure you have an up-to-date internet security programme installed on your computer which includes anti-virus protection as well as protection against spyware and adware. Keep it updated regularly; download security updates as they become available. Be careful about clicking links and attachments in e-mails. Don't click on links from an unknown sender. Remember that spammers could also gain access to a friend's account, so if you get an unsolicited and/or uncharacteristic e-mail containing a link from a friend, do not click on it but find another way of contacting them (e.g. by telephone or text message) to check that the message is genuine. Similarly, do not click on links or download attachments sent via instant messaging unless you are completely sure of the source

- Remember that free screensavers and games can be used to infect computers with viruses. Never download them, no matter who has sent them to you.
- Never click on a link in an e-mail from your bank. If you want to use online banking, enter the website address in the address bar yourself, so that you know you are going to the right website and not a fake site designed to replicate the genuine article.
- Leave a website if you feel suspicious - if the site doesn't look or 'feel' right, if there is text that doesn't appear to have any purpose or doesn't tie in with the rest of the site, or if you feel uneasy for any reason. Never download anything you are not sure about. **Hoax-Slayer**, **Get Safe Online** and **snopes.com** are useful websites where you can read about the latest online scams and hoaxes and avoid falling for them
