"A Phillips Screwdriver" Let me put a picture into your mind's eye. There is a beautiful Healey sitting in a shop. The mechanic and owner is wearing his overalls looking for a tool in the chest. After a bit of looking he has the "ahaa" moment and pulls out the perfect tool...something he himself created years back for just one purpose...to pull off the widget from the whatsit that is connected to the big thing where it is difficult to reach. This scenario leads to the question of "What are the tools that make our wheels go-round?" I have a drawer in my tool chest just for those tools that are used infrequently but are important, critically important, when needed. There is the brake line which is bent to a specific angle and is stuck in one's ear (yes, it looks ridiculous) for the purpose of listening to various parts of the engine. Trying to remove the large brass "castellated" nut from the bottom of the transmission normally requires an expensive socket (unless you try to use a screwdriver as a sort of punch...which is definitely not recommended). I, with the help of some friends in a shop, created a special socket by cutting tabs in the top edge of an appropriately sized pipe. I have wrenches that have been ground down to about ½ thickness to get into very tight spots, ½ inch drives that have been ground down so they can remove pipe plugs from transmissions and differentials, and a specially cut tube that is used in the process of filling the transmission. Of course each of these tools serves a specific purpose allowing me to accomplish some goal. I am curious what are some of the special tools that you have created? Incidentally, the best special tool I own is the beer, er...soda bottle opener. Somehow that tool helps all the other tools work better. "What do you get when you mix milk of magnesia with

TECH TIP: Exhaust Systems

Have you ever wondered what it actually was that made you want the newer car you test-drove? In most cases, the most impressive quality is how smooth and effortlessly it drives at highway speeds. It's very easy to not miss what you don't have. So after you've been acclimated to your old beater daily driver for ten years, it's a real surprise how nice a newer car or pickup can feel.

So what's this got to do with your exhaust system? Plenty. Unwanted vibrations can date a vehicle before its time is up. Whether from bent wheels, out of round or unbalanced tires, bad u-joints, bad motor mounts, even things like out of balance radiator fans or clutch parts. But one of the most annoying is a poorly suspended exhaust system.

In the last month I had two cars with serious vibration problems. The one was a Triumph TR-4A that I'd done a complete engine rebuild on including a full balance job. At 3200RPM it felt like the drive shaft was going to come flying out. But it was always the same (3200RPM) no matter what gear I was in, so the exhaust system was the first thing I checked. Sure enough, the rear twin mufflers were mounted almost solidly to the frame with only thin rubber washers as mounts.

New car manufacturers go to great lengths to design exhaust system hangers. Every engine, and even sub species of that same engine, have different vibration harmonics. Muffler size and type, along with tail pipe length and diameter has effects too. But back to your prize collector vehicle. When installing a new exhaust system, especially a custom system, use the longest most flexible mount you can fit in. It is better to use several soft mounts rather than one heavy-duty stiff mount. Most parts stores will gladly let you look through their parts catalog to view various possibilities. You'll be surprised at how many choices you'll see. One mount that I use quite a bit, is the type that looks like a flat strip of belted rubber, that looks like it was cut out of the side-wall of a tire. They can be hung straight, twisted, or even bent in a u-shape. A set of these completely cured the TR-4A vibration.

One Footnote: As much as clearance allows, always turn muffler clamps so the ends point up to reduce the possibility of snagging the clamp on any of a million things out there in everyday life.


