The proposed change in the GPA from 2.5 to 2.7 will serve to align the standards of our off-campus program to the standards of our on-campus program. The proposed coursework change will remove ARED 3603 (Public School Art) which neither Curriculum and Instruction nor the Art Department currently have the staff to facilitate and no longer offer. By replacing ARED 3603 with CIED 4113 (Integrated Communication Skills) graduates from the Elementary Education Licensure Program will be more knowledgeable in the area of literacy, both emergent literacy and extending literacy into the various content areas. The other changes in regards to order of courses allow the students to take the coursework in a more logical progression.

ELEMENTARY EDUCATION (ELEL)

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The Department of Curriculum and Instruction also offers the B.S.E. in elementary education licensure program. Students enrolled in this program typically complete most or all of the first two years of study at NorthWest Arkansas Community College prior to admission to the program. The final two years of the program are University of Arkansas courses offered at the UA Global Campus in Rogers.

Academic Regulations for Elementary Education Majors are as follows:

Pre-Admission

Students will complete the first two years of study at Northwest Arkansas Community College (NWACC). They will establish a GPA of 2.70 or better in the pre-requisite courses and pass Praxis I. Applicants must also hold a valid CPR card for both children and adults. The deadline for application to the UA course portion of this program and submission of Praxis scores is April 15 prior to Fall enrollment. Once the application materials are received, students will participate in an oral interview with program faculty. Eligibility to enroll in UA program courses is contingent upon successfully completing all requirements in the Pre-Admission phase.

UA Coursework Progression

Students will enroll in UA courses and maintain a GPA of 2.7 or better. They will be required to pass Praxis II: Early Childhood Content Knowledge in the junior year AND Praxis II: Principles of Learning and Teaching, Early Childhood in the senior year. This degree includes approximately 9 months of student teaching experience in a Rogers, Bentonville, or Springdale elementary school. Senior-level students must therefore attend full-time.

NOTE: All professional education courses in CIED must have a grade of "C" or better. No teaching methods courses may be taken by correspondence.

Elementary Education Nine-Semester Degree Program

The first two years of classes are taken at NorthWest Arkansas Community

College, therefore the course numbers listed for the first two years are NWACC course numbers. Beginning the Fall Semester of Year 3, UA course numbers are listed.
