ost of us know that a bowl gouge is the preferred tool for most cross-

If you peruse the woodturning tool catalogs, you will find that there are a wide variety of tools for sale to solve all

> of the various difficulties encountered in end grain turning. Some of these tools are complete systems of components that are quite pricey to say the least.

When faced with this overwhelming variety of tools, how is a person to decide which tool or system to select in order to perform the task at hand? Is it necessary to get a large loan at the bank just to turn a few end grain vessels? Obviously, there are a large number of options, some are relatively

inexpensive and others are very expensive.

By understanding the theory of how end grain wants to be cut without tearing out chunks of wood, both the tools and technique choices become

grain bowl turning where the grain direction is perpendicular to the length of the lathe bed. End-grain turning, defined as the case in which the grain of the wood is parallel to the length of the lathe bed, presents a completely different challenge in both turning techniques and tools used.

Turn it On

Jimmy Clewes

The library has recently acquired a three video set of Jimmy Clewes, "Turn it On".

Volume 1 has two projects, a footless bowl made from a piece of spalted birch burl and an oriental-style box from Rosewood with 22-carat gold leaf inlay. There are two extra features, one where Jimmy goes into more detail about flute

profiles and tool sharpening for bowl turning and the other looking into the life of a professional woodturner, shot in Belgium.

Volume 2 has two projects, a Ziricote bowl with a brass rim inlay and a long stem goblet turned unsupported from Australian Myrtle. Also include in Volume 2 are two extra features, one where Jimmy shows us how to prepare a fallen tree with a chainsaw for various turning projects, and the other in which he takes us to a British museum to show us actual Roman turnings including a 2000 year old box.




Volume 3 also includes two projects, the first a lidded box using a glue-up made from Maple and Wenge, and the second a footless bowl with silver highlights made from Walnut burl. Again as with the other two videos there are two extra features. Feature 1 shows Jimmy using computer graphics to show us his tried and tested technique for fitting a box lid. Extra Feature 2 shows behind-the-scenes work on the *Turn it On DVD* series.

This DVD series has some of the best video that I have every seen. The close ups are outstanding and after viewing the Behind-the-Scenes special feature you can appreciate all of the time and effort that went into producing these DVD. These are must see videos and have something for everyone. This series should be in every woodturner's library.

much more manageable. The August program will include information about the features and limitations of most of the end grain hollowing tools on the market and which of those tools and techniques would be best suited for different projects.

Educated as an instructor of high school musicians, John

spent a major portion of his life teaching a variety of subjects from high school band and choir to adult computer applications. Now he



teaches regular classes at the Woodcraft store in Addison and

one-on-one sessions on woodturning topics in his shop for beginning to intermediate turners.

When he is not teaching and attending woodturning meetings, he stays busy turning contract jobs for corporations and individuals on one or more of his three wood lathes.

John is a member of the AAW and is active in both the Woodturners of North Texas and the Golden Triangle Woodturners.

The club also purchases Anchorseal in 55-gallon drums and sells it to club members for only \$8.00 per gallon. You can obtain Anchorseal at the monthly meeting or go to Larry Robert's place if you need it sooner. This is a much lower cost than purchasing Anchorseal at the retail price where it is typically called "green wood sealer".

Be sure to read Stormy's column, "Making Good Shavings" this month. He reminds us that it is time to begin turning bowls for our annual participation in the Empty Bowls Project, which is a fund raising event of the local food banks. Can you turn enough bowls to match the record set last year by Max Taylor? Even if you find only enough "spare" time to turn one bowl for this worthwhile event, it will make a big difference in fighting hunger in Tarrant County. After considerable debate, we have decided to not set a maximum limit on the number of bowls that you can turn for Empty Bowls.

Finally, the Arlington Historical Society would like to have woodturners participate in craft demonstrations during the Front Street Festival (www.arlingtontxhistoricalsociety.org/frontst.nxg).
