HORSE LEASE APPLICATION

Leasing a horse involves all the cost of owning horse, including shoeing and minor veterinary work, without having to purchase one. Each lease is individually negotiated. The owner of the horse may charge a monthly lease fee or require you to carry equine insurance, depending on the value and show level of the horse.

Once a horse is found, a lease agreement will be completed and signed by both Lessor and Lessee. Leases are for a minimum of 60 days (unless otherwise negotiated in advance), with a minimum of 1 month notice required to terminate.

Veterinarian cost: \$40 to \$200+/-per month. Generally horses are wormed and vaccinated quarterly, and have their teeth floated sometimes twice a year. The horse may require a vet exam for lameness, colic, or injury or may need a routine procedure involved in keeping the horse sound and healthy. If this should occur the Lessee is responsible for payment.

Insurance: It is recommended, and the lessor may require that the horse be insured for the duration of the lease. Horses are generally insure for both mortality and major medical, the cost of which is determined by the value of the horse.

Shoeing Costs: This fee varies depending on the type of shoes (ready-made, hand forged, aluminum etc.) and shoeing (clips, pads, drilling) required by the horse. During the summer your leased horse's shoes will need to be drilled for grass caulks if showing on the grass.

Horse Shows: Should you be interested in competing at horse shows, Tanya will review entry fees, hauling, day charges, braiding, and other fees involved with you showing your leased horse.

Tack and Equipment: The Lessee should at this time own their own saddle, girth, pads and all other tack. Tanya will make sure your saddle property fits your leased horse. The owner may provide the bridle, sheet, blanket or other equipment needed for the horse. This will be reviewed when a suitable horse is found.
