

The Typhoon

Imagine driving 60 miles an hour down a highway and sticking your head out the window of the car. (Please don't try this at home.) Consider how distressing that experience would be. That puts into perspective what hundreds of thousands of people in the Philippines experienced when they had sustained (that is constant) winds of 120 miles per hour for four hours -- with gusts over 200 miles an hour. And when the typhoon was over, imagine looking at your neighborhood and seeing that not one home is there anymore. We had superstorm Sandy last year. It was a real inconvenience. But nothing in comparison to what the people of the Philippines are living through in the aftermath of their typhoon. We take a second collection today to provide needed relief to our brothers and sisters half a world away. We pray each day for the recovery effort. We give thanks to God for our blessings. I can't swim. Despite repeated attempts to learn throughout my life, I still can't swim. I am most disabled when I'm in over my head. On the other hand, I have no problem moving about when I'm on land. And as long as you don't see me in water, you'll never know about my disability.

Some people are more disabled on land. You see them in a wheelchair or with a walker. And it's odd -- and wrong -- to then presume that they are somehow diminished as people, that perhaps they can't think or speak or serve as well as the walking-ones. I sometimes notice people speaking loudly and slowly to people in wheelchairs, which is kind of strange since it's their legs, not their ears that are disabled.

Of course some people do have diminished hearing. Or a diminished ability to understand or remember. Some people are losing or have lost their eyesight. Some must always be aware of the nearest bathroom so they can get there when "nature calls." And let's face it, all of us have some disability, whether it's the inability to carry a tune or to bowl. I hope that none of us defines ourselves by what we cannot do. (I, for instance, do not wake each day reflecting on my inability to swim.) Yet sometimes when we see people who have certain disabilities, we define them by that aspect of their life. "There's the blind woman." Or "There's the deaf man." Or "Look at that teenager." (Sorry, teens...but sometimes people consider teen years to be a disability, just as you might consider old people to be disabled.)

At this time of year, church communities across the country take a moment to reflect on how inclusive we are with people with disabilities. We ask ourselves whether we leave people out of active ministry because of one disability or another. We think about what God-given gifts each person has and how they can be encouraged to share these gifts with the community.

Among the obvious blessings I've noticed at St. Bernard's are the number of people with different abilities as well as disabilities who are active in coming to church each week and some who are involved in different ministries. We continue to welcome people of all abilities to be involved in the mission of our parish in bringing Jesus' presence to others and spreading the Good News of the gospel in our community.





If you can help with any of these items, we would be most grateful. As always, many thanks!


Special thanks to Island Trees **Girl Scout Troop 3310**

LITURGY CORNER

Thirty-third Sunday in Ordinary Time November 17, 2013

The theme of suffering and redemption go hand in hand in Christian theology. Good Friday leads to Easter Sunday. Death to sinfulness leads to Christ's invitation to the fullness of life. In the same way, Christ describes the end times being preceded by turmoil and trials. Whatever we may face, our faith in Jesus Christ teaches us to trust that his redeeming love will always win out at the end.

First Reading: The day of the Lord will be a day of judgment and vindication: judgment against Israel's enemies and Israelites who were unfaithful, and vindication for all who were faithful. It will be a time of healing and wholeness. That day is coming soon, says the prophet Malachi.

Second Reading: The Thessalonians are to imitate Paul's example in working for their livelihood to avoid

being a burden on anyone. They are to be focused on the Lord Jesus and the work that is theirs, not dissipated in their thoughts and actions.

Gospel: speculation about the end-time has been around for a long time. When will it happen? What signs will precede it? People have always wanted certainty about it. In today's Gospel, Jesus warns his listeners against false prophets and mistaken signs. With foreboding words, he tells his disciples that before the end comes, they will suffer and be persecuted because of his name—even by members of their own families. He assures the disciples of his presence with them and promises that through perseverance they will save their lives.

Saints of the Week

Monday, November 18. Dedication of the Basilicas of Saints Peter and Paul. There are four major basilicas in Rome, and each of them has an observance on the church's universal calendar: Saint Mary Major on August 5, Saint John Lateran on November 9, and now the Basilicas of Saint Peter and Saint Paul. It is not so much the church buildings we are honoring, of course, as the saints to whom they are dedicated.

Also:

Beginning her life as a nun in the Order of the Visitation in France, **Saint Rose Philippine Duchesne** (1769-1852) eventually joined the Society of the Sacred Heart, founded by Saint Madeleine Sophie Barat. Due to her missionary zeal, she was sent, along with five other sisters, to St. Louis, Missouri, to care for the poor and educate Native Americans. Under her leadership, the sisters established numerous schools and orphanages. She is remembered for her remarkable work, including evangelization and catechesis with Native Americans, particularly the Potawatomi people.

Thursday, November 21. The Presentation of the Blessed Virgin Mary. According to tradition, Mary spent her life at the temple from the

time she was a little girl. Her parents, Joachim and Anna, presented their young daughter to the temple for service and study, in thanksgiving for the great gift God had given them through her. Mary, conceived in grace, was prepared to carry the Son of God, but her time at the temple helped form her mind and heart. Today's memorial celebration calls us to think about the ways we prepare and ready ourselves for Jesus Christ in our lives.

Friday, November 22. According to legend, Saint




Cecelia (third century) was beheaded because she would not forsake her vow of virginity. She is the patron saint of musicians, singers, and poets. Her association with music is most likely related to a line from her Passio (the oldest historical account of her life), where she is said to have sung "in her

heart to Christ" as the musicians played at her wedding. Cecelia's popularity grew so much that several hymns were written in her honor, and her life is referenced in Chaucer's *Canterbury Tales*.
