Notes from the Campus Minister/Counselor

STAR

Students Teacher Advisory and Recreation (STAR) is the name given to the time spent each day when students meet with their advisor. Each student has been grouped with 11 to 14 other students and has been assigned an advisor teacher for the school year. This teacher becomes an expert on your child. This teacher is a direct link between you and other teachers in your child's life. Together, parents and the advisor can help make the transition to Middle School easier and help ensure that older students are well prepared for high school. Mrs. Kalaus, our school counselor, is responsible for helping teachers in the role of advisor. By offering various activities which help foster self-esteem, reinforce values and make students better decision makers, STAR time can be effectively used to promote social, emotional and spiritual growth in all students.

Each month STAR groups will focus on a character education theme on which activities and discussions will be centered. September will be all about "Getting to Know You." STAR time will include ice-breakers and teambuilding activities done in small STAR groups as well as some with the grade level. Teachers will take time to help students foster and build positive relationships with their teachers and one another.

Masses, Prayer Services and Collections

Every Thursday we will gather as a Faith Community to pray together. We will celebrate Mass or have a religion class lead us in a prayer service. On these special days we will also pass the baskets for a collection. We feel it is important to model the practice of tithing and to encourage our students to do the same. Our collection for the month of September will benefit Habitat for Humanity.

In our first prayer service tomorrow, students will learn the story of Mary Our Lady of Hope, for which or beautiful chapel is named. Guidance

SMCMS employs a full time School Counselor whose role is to advocate for students' educational, social, emotional and spiritual well-being. Mary Lou Kalaus can be found at SMCMS all day, every day. Mrs. Kalaus meets with each grade throughout the school year in a various classroom settings and works with Mr. D, the health teacher, as well as the STAR teachers to help students learn more about developmental issues they face as young teenagers. Topics including conflict resolution, problem solving, decision making, career awareness, resiliency against drugs and other unhealthy behaviors and acceptance of diversity are just a few examples of the "Developmental Guidance" subjects that will be covered.

Mrs. Kalaus also provides small group opportunities on topics such as friendship, loss, and family separations for students as well as opportunities for one-on-one



counseling. Students are encouraged to stop in and meet Mrs. Kalaus during their free hours or after school in her office. Mrs. Kalaus can also be found in the cafeteria walking around talking to students during lunchtime. Counselors love to hear about the positive things that are happening with young people as well as the challenging... no matter how "big" or "small"! Students and parents can feel free to partner with Mrs. Kalaus with any concerns to find healthy and productive solutions to any concerns they face.

Fall Camp, Teambuilding and Retreat

This Thursday and Friday, September 3 and 4, our **eighth graders** will be at Camp Lakota for a two day event for teambuilding and retreat. Students will develop leadership skills and learn to prioritize their goals for the year, both in faith and academics.

Next Thursday, September 10, our **seventh graders** will go to Camp Lakota for a one day teambuilding/retreat event. They will focus on a theme of "Acceptance" as they learn to celebrate diversity and work to be inclusive. This is a particularly pertinent them for seventh grade, which seems to be the peak grade with "growing pains." In middle school, with students trying to figure out where they fit in, they often "compare" themselves to one another, which can lead to "judgment" of their peers. This retreat/teambuilding day reminds students of the value of diversity and the dignity of all!

Finally, **sixth graders** will spend Friday, September 11 participating in our annual Teambuilding Day. This is a day designed to help STAR groups learn to work together, effectively problem solve, increase trust and self-confidence, improve communication and listening, increase personal responsibility, and give students a sense of empowerment. It will also give them practice in removing unnecessary limitations they may put on themselves when considering possible solutions to the problems posed by the activities. At the end of the day, it is typical to see that STAR groups have bonded and are able to support each other throughout the school year.

These days are important for personal and groups growth. Please keep all the students in your prayers on these various days of retreat, teambuilding and personal growth.
