Their teachers report they are **SET** for an excellent academic course. Their parents said "the therapy has been fun for the children and they are much more confident."





GOAL. Left knee arthritis pain brought *Siri Mortimer* to the RCCA for intensive therapy a few years ago when she quickly met her initial GOAL. She continues her physical therapy wellness program with *Paul Hughes* in addition to an amazing 45 minutes on the elliptical machine. Now she also volunteers in the preschool commenting that "I have witnessed extraordinary things happening at the RCCA."
