## Keynote Speaker ~ Tom Clements

**Director, Colorado Department of Corrections  
Meeting Mental Health Needs in Our Prison System**

Tom Clements has more than 32 years of experience working in corrections. He is committed to seeking progressive and fiscally responsible leadership in corrections; emphasizing innovation in programs and services, successful offender reentry, and evidence-based practices in both prisons and community based corrections. Mr. Clements was formerly the Director of the Division of Adult Institutions for the Missouri Department of Corrections and was responsible for 21 adult prisons throughout the State of Missouri.

Mr. Clements will discuss how the Department of Corrections (DOC) is working to better meet the needs of individuals with mental illness in the prison system. He will speak about how the mental health unit is working at the Colorado State Penitentiary in Cañon City, how corrections is meeting needs of individuals with mental health issues in solitary confinement and how the DOC is designing the transition process for inmates with mental illness who are being paroled.
