MEDICATIONS:

You can give your child acetaminophen (Tylenol ®) every 4-6 hours if he is irritable or has a fever. Please call if he develops a temperature over 101.5°F (38.6°C). If you received a prescription pain medicine, use it for the first 24 hours, only if you think he needs it. Older children (typically older than 5 years) may need it longer (3-5 days). The prescription pain medicine has Tylenol ® in it. Do not give both over-the-counter Tylenol ® and prescription pain medication. Follow the manufacturer's recommendations for the child's weight, and do not exceed maximum amount from all sources in 24 hours.

WOUND CARE:

- 1. If your child has a bandage, remove it after 48 hrs. The butterfly bandage (Steri-strips®) will fall off within a week.
- 2. If your child has a super glue type dressing, it will flake off over time.
- 3. Do not submerge the incision under water in the bath or shower for 5 days. Sponge bathe your child during this time. It is OK to clean the incision area gently with soap and water after 48 hours.
- 4. Redness, swelling, and / or bruising of the scrotum are normal and will gradually get better. Swelling, especially in the scrotum, can last for weeks.
- 5. Teenagers may benefit from ice packs applied gently to the scrotum on and off for the first 24 to 48 hours.

ACTIVITIES:

- 1. No swimming for 2 weeks.
- 2. No straddle toys / bikes / straddle swings for 3 weeks. Car seats and strollers are OK.
- 3. Teenagers should not drive for 2 weeks.
