Using Listen Up! Vermont ebooks on your Kindle Fire

Books from the Listen Up! Vermont Collection can be read on a Kindle Fire in both the Adobe EPUB and Kindle formats.

- To use Overdrive EPUB books, install the latest version of the Overdrive Media Console (available on the Amazon website) on your Kindle.
- Set up an Adobe ID to authorize the Overdrive Media Console on your Kindle. To obtain an Adobe ID, browse to https://www.adobe.com/account/sign-in.adobedotcom.html

Once you have all of the above, you can download Adobe EPUB books as follows:

- 1. On your Kindle, open the Overdrive Media Console
- 2. Authorize the Overdrive Media Console with your Adobe ID (you will be prompted to create an Adobe ID if you haven't already)
- 3. Click on the Get Books button in the upper right corner
- 4. Click on the **Add a Library** + button
- 5. Enter the Middlebury's zip code to search for Ilsley Library.
- 6. Select Ilsley Public Library from the list
- 7. On the GMLC (Green Mountain Library Consortium) webpage, click on the Login button on the right side
- 8. Select Ilsley Public Library from the list
- 9. Click on the <u>Ilsley Public Library users</u>, please click here to sign into this system link
- 10. Type in your library card number and click on the Login button
- 11. Click on the browse button and select browse all adobe EPUB eBook Titles.
- 12. Select an Adobe EPUB title that is available by clicking on the **add to basket** button
- 13. Click on the **Proceed to Checkout** button
- 14. Click on the Download button.
- 15. In the Overdrive Media Console, navigate to the Bookshelf to read your book.

Ilsley Library cardholders can borrow up to 3 ebooks or downloadable audiobooks at one time from the Listen Up! Vermont collection and may choose a lending period of 1 or 2 weeks for each title. And it's not necessary to return items: ebooks simply expire after the due date. There is no late fee! Returning books early, however, will immediately free up the cardholder's account to borrow additional titles
