This marks the **second of four weeks** to support a family in need through CCW's annual Adopt-a-Family program. We've committed to sponsoring 390 families, comprised of over 1,060 individuals,

which is similar to last year. The agencies we sponsor screen each family to ensure that we serve families who are truly in need and guide the families to request gifts in the \$30-\$40 range per person. <u>Currently, 687 people remain available for adoption.</u>






