Ebola Screening

As you are aware from the overabundance of news coverage, many steps are being taken to contain further spread of the Ebola virus. The Allen County Department of Health, consistent with guidelines from the CDC, has established

procedures for schools and other businesses to follow. Along with all other Allen County school corporations, NACS will voluntarily cooperate with the Allen County Department of Health and follow the prescribed procedures. School personnel most likely to be involved in the screening process have been informed of the procedures. Throughout Allen County, all schools will begin formal implementation of the procedures no later than the morning of Wednesday, October 29. For more information, please refer to the letter on page 2 from Dr. McMahan, Health Commission of the Allen County Department of Health.

After consulting with health professionals, including Sandy Kelty our corporation lead nurse and the health care leaders at the Allen County Department of Health, the risks of encountering a person with Ebola is minimal. To reduce the likelihood of exposure, each of us should continue to exercise Universal Precautions, just like we have been expected to do since the late '80's when we began learning about reducing exposure to other pathogens that passed along through bodily fluids such as Hepatitis and HIV.

Thank you in advance for your patience and cooperation as we follow the procedures prescribed by the Allen County Department of Health.

2-Hour Delay Days

In order to prepare our teachers for the substantial changes that will be made to the state mandated ISTEP+ and End of Course Assessments, so that in return they can prepare your children, Northwest Allen County Schools will be implementing a series of pre-scheduled 2-hour delays. Dear Parent or Staff Member,

As you are aware, a large outbreak of Ebola virus in West Africa has resulted in a few isolated cases of the disease among healthcare workers in the United States. The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention and healthcare agencies across the country are taking the necessary precautions to prevent the further spread of Ebola within the United States.

The safety and well-being of our community is our highest priority. We are working with county healthcare providers, public safety and school systems to ensure that we have developed and implemented a coordinated plan to quickly identify and assess any potential health risks associated with travel to areas involved in the Ebola outbreak.

As part of that strategy, we will be asking that signage be posted in various places throughout the community, including schools, asking people to alert front office staff if they have recently traveled to one of the high-risk areas. This will allow health officials to quickly evaluate and minimize any potential risk to the public.

We have had a very successful and long-standing partnership with our county school systems and are very appreciative of their assistance in this important public health matter.

Scheduling For 2015-2016

Current 8th graders and their parents should mark their calendars for the orientation meeting that will be held the night of Monday, February 9 in the CHS large auditorium (snow date is Feb. 11). Classroom presentations at each middle school will be scheduled to occur following that orientation meeting. Counselors will be making class presentations to current 9th-11th graders during the last week of January and 1st week of February. Students will select courses, obtain teacher recommendations and parent signatures AND complete their online course selections by Feb. 12. All students will receive a copy of the new course description handbook and it will be available online at NACS website:

www.nacs.k12.in.us. Parents and students should review that handbook closely for new courses, prerequisites, recommendations and grade weighting. Students will receive more information regarding selecting courses online during the class presentations. Students that do not complete their course selections by the end of the day February 12th may have courses chosen for them and/or not be allowed schedule changes if requested. Any schedule changes should be made prior to May 1st and changes will be honored IF class sizes allow. Students and parents should review grades at the end of each semester to make certain that course prerequisite, grade recommendations and diploma requirements continue to be met. It is critical that students and parents take this course selection experience seriously. Students' academic preparation for future high school courses and post-secondary (life after high school) opportunities depend on foundation courses and performance. Carroll High School is committed to students' taking the most challenging courses appropriate to their abilities and career plans. It is also important for students and parents to understand that staffing and scheduling for the following year is driven by these course requests. Each year all students receive information for "high school to post-secondary planning" coordinated by their guidance counselor. During the freshman year, planning sessions are held individually or in small groups and include developing a 4-yr plan. In subsequent years the information is distributed via home rooms and during the scheduling presentations. This helps students move through the growth and research process as they match their interests with their strengths and needs. Students and counselors monitor transcripts relative to diploma types and consider career plans so that high school courses are chosen appropriately. It is also important that students begin their college research early to determine individual college admission requirements. In general, 4 year colleges require at least the Core 40 curriculum and often require additional math and world languages. Certain colleges dictate major-specific admission requirements. CHS strongly recommends that capable students strive for the Core 40 with Academic Honors to more fully meet college admission requirements.

To Friends and Family of the Carroll Community:

It is a long standing Carroll High School tradition for the senior class to present a gift to a family or organization who has touched the Carroll Community in a special way. The Class of 2015 takes this responsibility seriously as we have the opportunity to make a difference in the life of a deserving individual. The graduating Class of 2015 has chosen freshman student Wil Wigge as this year's gift recipient.

Wil was born with multiple birth defects, which has led to Wil being wheelchair bound. Wil was also born with a severe hip dysplasia. To this day, his right hip is permanently dislocated and can sometimes cause discomfort. There are several medical issues that the Wigge family has dealt with over the years; however the pressing one at the moment is Wil's wheelchair. The wheelchair is falling apart and does not give comfort to Wil's dislocated hip. One wheel cannot come off, which makes transportation difficult. The spokes are breaking, bolts and screws are coming out and are stripped, and only one brake works on the current wheelchair. Wil has had this chair for five years and his body has changed. The wheels are set too high and Wil now has calluses and ulcers on his elbows from rubbing on the wheels as he rolls himself around. Aside from all of the physical and medical setbacks, Wil is an ordinary 14 year old boy. He is very social and loves hanging out with his friends. Wil is determined to be as independent as possible and wheel his chair around himself.

The Class of 2015 and student body of Carroll High School needs your help to get Wil a new wheelchair. We are welcoming monetary donations and merchandise. Any merchandise will be used for a silent auction on February 20, 2015. We thank you in advance for your contribution and for supporting Wil Wigge.

CHS (10-12) Semi-Formal Dance
