NSHPCA Annual Conference 2011 "ROOTS, REALITY & REACHING OUT" Keynote Speakers



<u>Dr Nigel Sykes</u> read medicine at Oxford and is Medical Director and Consultant in Palliative Medicine at St Christopher's Hospice, London. He is also Honorary Consultant in Palliative Medicine at Guy's and St Thomas' Hospitals, and Honorary Senior Lecturer in Palliative Medicine at King's College, London.


Dr. Sykes' principal research interests concern gastrointestinal and end-of-life symptom management in palliative care, on which he has written extensively. He also teaches widely both in the UK and abroad. Currently chair of Help the Hospices International Palliative Care Reference Group he is also a member of the Neurological Diseases Strategy Group of the UK National Council for Palliative Care.

Dr. Sykes has served as Treasurer of the Association of Palliative Medicine of Great Britain and Ireland, and as a member of the Association's Executive and Ethics committees. He set up the first clinical ethics committee to be located in a hospice and has spoken on television and radio, and made presentations to British parliamentary committees, on ethical issues relating to palliative care.



Elizabeth M. Davis is a member of the Congregation of the Sisters of Mercy of Newfoundland and Labrador. She is presently the Congregational Leader of the Sisters of Mercy. She has been a part-time faculty member at St. Augustine's Seminary (Toronto) as well as a member of the Board of the Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Canada, the Board of Regis College (Toronto School of Theology), the Canadian Health Services Research Foundation and the Medical Council of Canada. She has also been a member of the National Board of Medical Examiners of the United States, the Canadian Institute for Health Information and the Faculty for Dalhousie University's Management Program for Clinical Leaders

She taught high school in Newfoundland (1969-1982), and served as Executive Director of St. Clare's Mercy Hospital (1986-1994) and as the first President and Chief Executive Officer of the Health Care Corporation of St. John's (1994-2000). She was one of three Commissioners on the *Royal Commission on Renewing and Strengthening Newfoundland and Labrador's Place in Canada* (June 2002 – June 2003). Among her recent awards are receipt of an honorary Doctor of Laws from Memorial University of Newfoundland (May 2002), appointment as a Member of the Order of Canada (May 2004), the 2006 Leadership Achievement Award from the University of Toronto Society of Graduates in Health Policy, Management & Evaluation; the Canadian Federation of Nurses' Unions *Bread and Roses Award* (2007), appointment as an Honorary Fellow of the Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Canada (2008), appointment as *Alumna of the Year* for Memorial University of Newfoundland (2008), and receipt of an honorary Doctor of Laws from the University of Manitoba (May 2009).



<u>Kelly Walker</u> is a teacher. For many years he has helped people read the signs of the times, acquire language, skills and understanding in order to live more vibrant lives. He is an author, speaker, therapist and a musician. He spent the first 20 years of his adult life in a Dominican monastery where he was elected Prior for nine years. After a year of studies in art and spirituality in Florence, he returned to Toronto to suffer a severe breakdown that would lead him out of the Order. At 40 he rose up out of the ashes of burnout and began a concert career as a singer-songwriter.

Out of the numerous requests to speak and teach about work addiction and burnout and change, he opened a private practice. He taught at the Toronto School of Theology and Huron and Trinity Colleges. He is a very popular public speaker and tours extensively throughout North America, the Caribbean and the UK with businesses, health care, education and clergy. Kelly's book LOSS OF SOUL: burnout is a Canadian best seller as is his second book, DANCING ON THE ARK: facing change in uncertain times. His third book, GROWING SOMEWHERE: living life after mid-life is receiving rave reviews. His two latest CDs, All My Life and River Ash are loved the world over. Last year he was awarded the Pauline McGibbon Life Achievement in the Arts Award at Roy Thompson Hall in Toronto. He lives in Stratford, the Festival City, in Ontario.


