PAPUNYA VISIT

The visit from the group of children and their teachers from Papunya has been rescheduled for the 17th of October. I was fortunate to have spent ten days there in the recent school holidays. As you can imagine there is a great deal of excitement form the children and their families about the upcoming trip. (Not all of the children have had their places confirmed as yet.) Such is life in Papunya that family circumstances and events may impact on a child's attendance at school or in fact within community.

I spent my first few days with the children from my old class. It was exciting to see the progress they had made with their learning and rekindle my relationship with them. I was reminded too of how daunting it will be for the children on their visit to Melbourne. We will have to be understanding of their shyness and not misinterpret it as rudeness.

During my visit, Papunya was a mixture of sadness and also great excitement. On the one hand there had been the passing of one of the original Papunya artists of the Western Desert Art movement of the 1970's, Kumuntjayi Stockman. Also, the Papunya Sports carnival involving hundreds of people travelling up to ten hours to participate in a four-day celebration of football, softball, culture and family was taking place.

Meanwhile back in Moonee Ponds the parents of Room 21 were developing a roster to provide lunches and snacks for our visitors. On my return to school I have been approached by eager children and parents from across the school asking when the children will be arriving. The library is also ready with thanks to Michele who has made a lovely welcoming display!

Our principal Jeff sent me a link from a Radio National interview with a Western Desert art expert, Vivien Johnson who has just this week launched a new book in Sydney, "Streets of Papunya-The Re-Invention of Papunya Painting." I have included the link for those who may be interested in the interview. I can also recommend the book which provides a detailed history of the Papunya art movement and its artists many of whom are the grandparents of the children who will be visiting us.
