SAN JUAN WESTERNS: The Westerns were held north of Bremerton, Washington at the Brownsville's Marina. Attendance was low with the nationals being held at the same time in the Midwest and many CBYC members having an extra busy summer — only four boats in all-sails and 13 in working sails. The winds were moderate to light with very little current action. Steve and Linda Kridelbaugh, the only CBYC sailors, managed to finish 5th. Fleet One members were great hosts with a crab feed for the banquet. Next year the Westerns will be held in Klamath Falls.

SAN JUAN'S INVITED TO WOODEN BOAT REGATTA: The 2005 Norm Blanchard WOOD (Wood Open and One Design) Regatta will be held September 23 - 25. Registration for the regatta is \$1 per foot. The race is open to all wooden sailboats 8' and up. There is a separate course for boats up to 15'. There will be classes for cruiser-racers as well as one-design fleets. The one-design fleet races under Portsmouth Yardstick numbers while the larger boats will race under PHRF for the first time this year. **Our Classic Plastic fleet will be the San Juan 21' again this year.** The regatta will kick off Friday night with the Bite of Lake Union, hosted by area restaurants. Saturday, there will be 3 races following a continental breakfast, and a dinner in the evening. 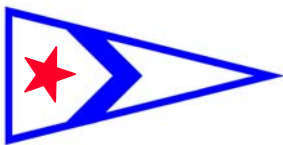
