

Request for evaluation of mathematics course for transfer credit

Documentation: Please attach a detailed syllabus, including course outline, course prerequisites, textbook used, chapters covered, and if possible a copy of the final exam. The most difficult transfers are M118 and K310. These cases require the most documentation. Course descriptions alone will not be accepted.
This process may take 3-4 weeks.

Please check to confirm that official course materials are included:

- Title of textbook (Required)
- Chapters covered (Required)
- Topics covered (Required)
- Course pre-requisites (Required)
- K310 only: evidence of a calculus pre-requisite or evidence of the use of calculus in the treatment of distributions. (Required)
- Other materials (Class notes, sample exams, etc.) (Recommended)

M118: A course to transfer as M118 must be approximately 50% probability, including conditional probability. It must also include some basic matrix algebra and linear programming and also Markov chains or another appropriate topic in the "finite mathematics" realm. Students often mistakenly ask to transfer an introductory statistics course as M118.

K310: You must provide explicit evidence that the course being transferred has a calculus prerequisite, or makes use of calculus concepts in the treatment of distributions. Please highlight in yellow the calculus pre-requisite and /or course content for K310. The Department of Statistics also evaluates K310 courses.

M119: Most "applied calculus", "business calculus" or "calculus for social sciences", etc., will transfer without question as M119.

M211: Traditional calculus courses that will transfer as M211 always include trigonometric functions. The textbooks are NOT titled "Applied Calculus". Rather they are usually titled "Calculus" or "Calculus with Early Transcendentals", etc.
