Due to the limited seating only confirmed totals will be seated in the Giant Screen Theater.

POLICY GUIDELINES TO BE FOLLOWED:

***<u>To assure the safety of all visitors and exhibits, youth</u> <u>MUST BE supervised. Because ceremonies may be taking</u> <u>place in the Museum , please keep the sound of your</u> <u>group to a minimum.</u>

ABSOLUTELY NO RUNNING! Backpacks, food, gum, candy and drinks ARE NOT allowed inside the Museum. There are no indoor lunch provisions available in the event of inclement weather.

Giant Screen Theater Policy:

Reservations must be made in advance. <u>Please arrive 30 to</u> 45minutes prior to your scheduled Giant Screen movie. Late arrivals aren't guaranteed a seat in the movie. Upon arrival group leader should report to Giant Screen Theater ticket counter for payment. One adult chaperone is required for every ten students and remain with them at all time. Required chaperones and teachers receive free admission to attractions. Any additional adults, over the required number of chaperones will pay the school rate of \$5.00. Please arrange chaperones and students in your desired order prior to entering the theater. School groups are seated in the theatre approximately 20 minutes before show time and are not permitted to change seats . Single file only. Please we need to have a complete total of movie seats being purchased students, adults and chaperones on the day before.

Instructions given by Visitor Attraction staff must be followed.

<u>Motion Based Flight Simulator</u>

(MBS) (one adult chaperone for every group of 14 children required): The simulator is pre-programmed. Simulation is controlled by the computer. Simulated motions include acceleration, deceleration, slow and sharp turns and dives. The motion experience runs for approximately five (5) minutes. There are no individual controls to affect the simulator motions. This ride is not recommended for 3rd if below and if prone to motion sickness. (one adult chaperone per 14 students is required for this ride)

LUNCH OUTDOORS:

Only outdoor picnic areas are available on first come basis. School groups must clean up after themselves. Food and drinks should be carried into designated lunch areas in coolers. Do not bring lunches into the Museum.

<u>New policy: Backpacks, coolers, & lunches are not</u> <u>allowed in the museum.</u> <u>All purses, pocketbooks, bags and drawstring bags</u> <u>will need to be searched.</u> <u>Photo ID for anyone over 18 yrs old.</u>

Guidelines for Chaperones

Chaperones play an essential role in creating a positive visitor experience. As a chaperone, your supervision is required to monitor and maintain the good behavior and safety of the students in your group.

Responsibilities of Chaperones

- Please ensure that you and your group of students (10 students or fewer per chaperone) stay together during your time in the museum. This includes the Museum Gift Store and the Kiddie Hawk play area.
- Chaperones are responsible for keeping track of each student in their group.
- While at the Museum, you are required to stay with the students assigned to you and to guide them through the exhibits.
- It is your responsibility to maintain the good behavior and safety of the students in your group. Encourage students to adhere to the Behavior Guideline outlined below.
- Check with the group leader if there are certain exhibits or activities the students must see or do during the visit.
- Make sure you know the time and place to meet for scheduled events.
- If you have questions, ask a Visitor Attractions staff or volunteer for help.
- Follow all instructions provided by Visitor Attractions staff and volunteers.

Behavior Guidelines

• Encourage students to be courteous and respectful by talking quietly and walking, not running through the Museum.

- Do not climb on exhibits, railings or ledges.
- Students must stay with their chaperones at all times while in the Museum and the Museum Gift Store.
- Please do not push, fight or throw things.
- Try to use the stairs. The elevator is reserved for people pushing strollers or visitors with disabilities.
- In the instance of disruptive behavior teacher and/or chaperone will be approached to resolve the situation.
- If the behavior persists, the museum reserves the right to ask students(s) to leave the Museum.
