

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Brazos High School Parent Notification Letter 2015 Compliance with P.L. 107-110, Section 1111(h)(6)(A)

To: All Parents

From: Brazos High School Date: October 1, 2015

Subject: Notification to Parents of Teacher Qualifications

As a parent of a student at Brazos High School you have the right to know the professional qualifications of the classroom teachers who instruct your child. Federal law allows you to ask for certain information about your child's classroom teachers, and requires you to receive this information in a timely manner. Specifically, you have the right to ask for the following information about each of your child's classroom teachers:

- Whether Brazos High School has licensed or qualified the teacher for the grades and subjects he or she teaches.
- Whether Texas Education Agency has decided that the teacher can teach in a classroom without being licensed or qualified under state regulations because of special circumstances.
- The teacher's college major; whether the teacher has any advanced degrees and, if so, the subject of the degrees.
- Whether any teachers' aides or similar paraprofessionals provide services to your child and their qualifications.

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TRUANCY

House Bill 2398, passed this 84th legislative session, made numerous changes to the truancy laws in Texas. This piece of legislation became effective September 1, 2015.

TRUANT CONDUCT. If a student is absent from school on 10 or more days or parts of days within a six-month period in the same school year. **Family code 65.003**

WARNING NOTICE: If a student is absent on 10 or more days or parts of days within a six month period, the student's parent is subject to prosecution and the student is subject to referral to truancy court for civil processing.

If a student has been absent without excuse on three days or parts of days within a four-week period, the school district shall issue a warning notice to inform the parent that the student is subject to truancy prevention measures in addition to other statutory requirements in existence. **Education Code 25.095**

TRUANCY PREVENTION MEASURES

- ★ Impose a behavior improvement plan including the specific behavior required or prohibited of the student and the period of time the plan will be in place. Education Code 25.0915
- ★ Impose school-based community service
- * Refer the student to counseling, mediation, mentoring, teen-court, or other in-school or out-of-school service aimed at addressing truant behavior

OLDER STUDENTS: Students attending school after age 19 may have their enrollment revoked if the student has more than 5 unexcused absences in one semester. **Education Code 25.085. Family Code 65.002**
