Access Points to the Florida Standards

In the past, the performance and progress of students with significant cognitive disabilities was not assessed via the FCAT. These students were working from an "alternative curriculum" and a corresponding functional assessment. This curriculum addressed functional living skills, and was not aligned with the expectations for the Sunshine State Standards (SSS). A great deal of time has been spent closely examining the expectations and outcomes of the Standards with the following thought in mind: "How can we design activities and multiple opportunities for students with significant cognitive disabilities-at the appropriate level-so that we can be assured that each and every student has a chance to demonstrate his/her understanding of the learning represented by each standard? In other words, how can we look at each standard and then create an 'entry point' or 'access point' for students with disabilities that parallel the expectation of each standard while representing a different degree of task complexity.

As a result of this concern, as part of the revision to the Sunshine State Standards, access points for students with significant cognitive disabilities have been developed. Embedded in the Sunshine State Standards, access points

Florida's Virtual ESE Online Distance Learning Program



Currently access points are available for language arts and mathematics. Science is scheduled for January 2008, with other subjects to follow.

The individual education plan (IEP) team is responsible for determining which students will be working on the access points and taking the alternate assessment. It is the intent of the Florida Department of Education (FDOE), that students with significant cognitive disabilities *will* be addressing the expectations of the Sunshine State Standards, in ways that are closely parallel to other students and that honor each student's ability to learn and demonstrate academic success.
