The MCSP has exclusions to the collection of skin malignancies based upon the primary site and histology. If the following histologies arise in the skin (C44.0 – C44.9) they are NOT reportable regardless of the stage at the initial time of diagnosis. All other histologies of the skin are reportable, i.e.: melanoma, Kaposi sarcoma, mycosis fungoides, cutaneous lymphoma, etc.

Malignant Neoplasm (Carcinoma), NOS of the skin	8000 - 8004
Epithelial Neoplasms (Carcinoma), NOS of the skin	8010 - 8045
Papillary and Squamous Cell Neoplasm (Carcinoma) of the skin	8050 - 8082
Basal Cell Neoplasm (Carcinoma) of the skin	8090 - 8110

EXCEPTION: The above histologies **MUST** be reported if the primary site is skin of the male and female genital sites.

This is the version of Abstract Plus needed to process the NAACCR Version 12 records (required for records with a diagnosis date of January 1, 2010 or later). We are currently in the process of revising the Abstract Plus Training Manual for Michigan facilities. Our goal is to distribute the manual and update in early April 2011. 02/21/2011: Appendix C: Site Specific Coding Modules

Appendix C of the SEER Program Code Manual was created to eliminate the use of several manuals. Appendix C brings together site-specific instructions needed to abstract a case and facilitate efficiency and accuracy. Organized by primary site, the website provides ONE SOURCE for site-specific coding modules for SEER Coding Guidelines; Equivalent Terms, Definitions, Tables, Charts and Illustrations; Multiple Primary Rules; Histology Coding Rules; Collaborative Staging Coding Instructions and Surgery of Primary Site Codes. 1/17/2011: Update for Cancer Registrars-Collaborative Stage version 02.03.02

Some of the Updates related to the status of CS version 02.03.02 are listed below. The link to the CS web page is http://www.cancerstaging.org/cstage/.

- Cancer Registry Software Vendors were notified recently that the fourth production release of the Collaborative Stage Data Collection System (CS version 02.03.02) is now available. Each software vendor is responsible to communicate with their customers about their client software updates. Cancer Registries should look for communication directly from their software vendor or contact their software vendor directly with questions about client software updates.
- Along with the shift to v.02.03.02 software; the schemas have also been updated. The CS web page has both 02.03.02 and the version 02.02 schemas posted. When your vendor updates your software to include the 02.03.02 revisions; Cancer Registrars should immediately begin using the 02.03.02 schemas. While your software is still operating with version 02.02; Cancer Registrars should only use the 02.02 schemas.

• The General Rules (Part 1 Section 1) has also been updated for use with CS Version 02.03.02. However, do not use this version of the General Rules until you receive and install your software upgrade with CS version 02.03.02.

New Standards Coming from the American College of Surgeons \sim

Be on the look out for changes from the American College of Surgeons. They are working on a revised set of standards for approved hospitals that will be implemented in July 2012. A published set of 2012 standards will be completed in the summer of 2011. There will be a greater focus on patient centered standards like patient navigation systems, patient input, and quality of care metrics. This means that the Commission will enter an era of minimum patient care standards and other new benchmarks for their facilities. They have rewritten a significant portion of the Cancer Liaison for each center. This new language puts a fresh set of obligations specific to data use and data quality. A draft copy will be sent to the Liaisons over the next few weeks. There will be a series of educational opportunities at NCRA, a west coast workshop to cover the majority of the representatives and a Webinar series. Expect this to lead to hospital registry data serving as the source of critical metrics important to a hospitals assessment by ACOS.
