Explanation for Exemption from filing Form 990 or Form 990EZ.

The corporation was formed on March 9, 2007. It is between one and three years old. During the first year, it has only received contributions valued at \$93.53. During the second year (2008), it has received \$1,825, and at the most, is projected to have total receipts of \$51,825 for the fiscal year. The average of these two years (\$26,211) is less than the \$30,000 threshold of the “Gross Receipts Test.” Per the Instructions for Form 990 and Form 990-EZ, the corporation is deemed to have annual contributions of less than \$25,000 and is exempt from filing either form.

Part IV, Narrative Description of Activities

IRISC was created to provide expertise, education, and research with respect to rule of law and stabilization. IRISC will develop interdisciplinary expertise to use law as a means to foster reconstruction and provide stability to foreign states and regions at risk of, besieged with, or emerging from conflict due to civil strife. IRISC will partner or collaborate with governmental agencies, academic institutions, professional organizations, NGOs and others to advance its mission.

IRISC does not suggest that western-style legal codes and institutions are the only acceptable models. Rather, IRISC seeks to work within cultural contexts and encourage the "civic identity" necessary for the rule of law. As a fundamental part of its mission, IRISC is committed to a multi-cultural approach to the rule of law and stability—an attitude that is sensitive and responsive to the diverse values, contexts, interests and challenges facing unstable states and communities around the globe.

Future activities of IRISC will include:

- a. promoting, conducting and fostering interdisciplinary research, study and analysis relating to the social sciences (including legal, political, and military sciences and psychology, anthropology, and economics) with respect to establishment and security of the rule of law and political, social and economic stability;
- b. disseminating information and promoting, conducting and fostering other activities and educational programs designed to increase knowledge and understanding relating to these sciences and the rule of law;
- c. providing forums in which individuals and organizations may consult and cooperate in considering problems relating the establishment and security of the rule of law and political, social and economic stability.

Specifically, in the immediate future, IRISC is planning to seek grants to support interviews and a survey of U.S. military, State Department, and Agency of International Development personnel as to experiences bearing rule of law and stabilization issues encountered in Iraq, Afghanistan, and the Philippines. The resulting data will be compiled with findings in existing literature into published reports and a database on rule of law problems, strategies and outcomes. Additionally, IRISC officers are seeking funding to organize a conference with legal scholars from China, Thailand, Philippines, Hong Kong, Islamic countries and the United States to discuss non-western frameworks for the rule of law.

Describe all non-fixed compensation arrangements, including how the amounts are determined, who is eligible for such arrangements, whether you place a limitation on total compensation, and how you determine or will determine that you pay no more than reasonable compensation for services (refer to instructions for Part V, lines 1a, 1b, and 1c for information on what to include as compensation).

Compensation for all services (research services, presentations, publications, fundraising and administrative services) is deemed to be “non-fixed” because all compensation is dependent upon obtaining appropriate grant funding and government contracts and cannot be fixed on an annual or other regular basis by IRISC.

Compensation of directors, officers, fellows, employees, trustees, independent contractors shall be determined pursuant to provisions set forth in article IX, sec. 1 of IRISC’s bylaws. Such provisions will ensure that compensation is set based upon comparable salary and pay for similarly qualified individuals providing the same services at research universities or non-profit research institutions.

In particular, compensation data from institutions such as the College and University Professional Association for Human Resources and the Chronicle of Philanthropy will be used by an appropriate committee of IRISC comprised of disinterested members to set compensation. It is anticipated that compensation will also be negotiated as part of grant proposals prepared by IRISC for submission to appropriate government agencies and non-profit organizations. The bylaws expressly forbid compensation in excess of comparable rates at research universities and non-profit institutions.

Fellows of IRISC will be recruited from qualified academics, government and military personnel, and appropriate consultants in the private sector. These fellows will constitute a network of experts to provide the following programs:

Fostering interdisciplinary research: Through securing government and nonprofit grants, providing interdisciplinary research projects for researchers from diverse disciplines for study, analysis, and research on the establishment and security of the rule of law and political, social and economic stability.

Dissemination of research: Decision makers and interested parties in government, academia, non-governmental organizations with charitable purposes, and from the general public will benefit from published interdisciplinary research and educational programs with respect to establishing and securing the rule of law and political, social and economic stability.

Forums for discussion and cooperation: Decision makers and interested parties in government, academia, non-governmental organizations with charitable purposes, and from the general public will benefit from conferences and other forums dedicated to exchange of information and collaboration on establishing and securing the rule of law and political, social and economic stability.

1b: Describe each program that provides goods, services, or funds to organizations:

The same programs as described in 1a above will be provided to organizations, including government agencies, educational institutions, and non governmental organizations dedicated to charitable, scientific or educational purposes. In addition, IRISC may support or partner organizations with funds and resources which are exclusively charitable, scientific or educational in purpose and which provide the programs described in 1a above.

IRISC'S officers will invite select, qualified individuals to become members (fellows) as they may be needed for specific IRISC projects. The annual fee for IRISC membership fee has been initially set at \$25.00.

2. Foundation & Government Grant Solicitations

IRISC's Vice President for Project Development will be tasked with identifying the public interest with respect to stabilization and the rule of law, identifying appropriate foundation grant resources, and appropriate IRISC expertise to meet those needs. IRISC's Vice President for Administration and Fundraising will then develop grant proposals and solicit funding.

IRISC's expertise centers on the rule of law and the cultural prerequisites and factors influencing individual loyalty to the rule of law and democratic governments. Its purpose is to advise the US government, educators, and non governmental organizations as to how to positively impact the establishment and maintenance of the rule of law in countries critical to US interests. It is anticipated that the benefits of rule of law include a stable environment for economic growth by minimizing arbitrary regulation of state actors and promoting a predictable environment necessary for trade and commercial exchange.

Part VIII, Question 10:

Describe who owns or will own any copyrights, patents, or trademarks, whether fees will be charged, how the fees will be determined, and how many items are or will be produced, distributed, and marketed.

Per Article IX, section 2.C of IRISC's bylaws, it is anticipated that the end product of projects funded by grants and government contracts may be in published form. Per IRISC's bylaws, reports that are not classified by government agencies will be made available to the public at modest prices to simply recover the cost of dissemination. IRISC anticipates sponsoring a journal and newsletter and regularly publishing conference and seminar proceedings.

Per Article IX, section 2.D of IRISC's bylaws, the intellectual property rights to all such publications shall remain either with IRISC or the individual authors who have contracted their services to IRISC. In the event that copyright remains with individual authors, IRISC shall negotiate to provide the broadest public access to such published works as a prerequisite for publication with IRISC.

IRISC does not anticipate producing any product requiring patent protection and if its trade or service mark is protected it will remain the property of the corporation and only be protected to the extent necessary to avoid dilution of the utility of the mark so that IRISC may carry out its public purpose.

It is anticipated that research field work and other services may be provided in the Afghanistan, Iraq, Philippines, Indonesia, Thailand, and such other locations as determined by the US agencies from whom IRISC receives grant funding. It is not anticipated that IRISC will be funded from foreign governments or agencies or organizations formed under the laws of such governments.

IRISC will help assess conditions, advise on planning and operational environment, and establish appropriate metrics for measuring the effects and progress of rule of law initiatives in different regions and countries of the world. These metrics will be used by government agencies and non-governmental organizations to understand the impact of their own rule of law programs and operations. It will also host international conferences, publish international journals and reports, conduct field research for later publication, and consult with US government about the appropriate policies, programs, and organizational structure necessary to promote the rule of law and stability.

Two of IRISC's initial directors, officers and fellows serve on the faculty and in the administration of UMKC School of Law. It is anticipated that whenever possible they will utilize UMKC facilities, computers, and research support for conducting IRISC services. They may also take advantage of University grant application services. The remaining initial director (also an officer and fellow), Captain Donald Smith, II has been a member of the US military, specifically of the employ of the U.S. Joint Center for International Security Force Assistance ("JCISFA"). Captain Smith may leave the military to become a civilian and an IRISC employee. JCISFA is setting forth the specifications for proposals concerning stability operations and rule of law initiatives. To the extent not prohibited by US office of personnel management regulations and other law, Capt. Smith will work with IRISC to articulate the needs of the US military and identify funding opportunities.
