DUTIES: The incumbent will serve as the technical staff member responsible for the economic aspects of fishery management plan formulation, development, revision and implementation. Principal duties will involve: (1) developing economic models for documenting impacts of various management alternatives, (2) analyzing the economic impacts of proposed management measures and regulatory changes, (3) maintenance of an in-house economic database, (4) compilation and analysis of economic information on recreational and commercial fisheries, (5) presentation of these analyses to the Council and advisory groups and (6) general application of economic theory to fishery problems as they relate to fisheries management. Incumbent will also be responsible for controlled access management activities, including development and coordination of Individual Transferable Quota (ITQ) approaches to management of particular fisheries. Activities will involve contact and interaction with recreational and commercial fishermen, individuals associated with all levels and aspects of the recreational and commercial fishing industries, various public groups, state and federal agency personnel and Council members.

QUALIFICATIONS: This position requires a M.S. or higher degree in economics or in a multidisciplinary resource management field with significant economics training. Applicants will be rated on level of education in economics attained and demonstrated ability in the application of economics to resource problems. Preference will be given for demonstrated professional experience in addressing fishery-related resource problems, knowledge of computer science, and demonstrated technical verbal and writing skills.
