There's a new form to use

The DD Form 1172, (Sep 2005) "Application for Uniformed Services Identification Card DEERS Enrollment" was officially decommissioned October 16, 2012. The updated DD Form 1172-2 (Apr 2012), "Application for Identification Card/DEERS Enrollment," now serves as the application for DEERS enrollment, eligibility update, and ID card issuance.

The form is available online at www. dtic.mil/dtic/. Type the address into your web browser address bar, and search for DD form 1172-2 in the search bar at the top of the page.

The Army as a Profession: As some of you may or may not know the Army is looking at how we as Soldiers can validate what it means to be a Professional. The following are excerpts from Center for the Army Profession and Ethic (CAPE) Combined Arms Center (CAC) and Training and Doctrine Command (TRADOC)

"The Army Profession is a Vocation"

A vocation is a calling to undertake a specific kind of work. Army Soldiers have answered the call of the people of the United States and their leaders. The Army establishes a professional culture and identity. This culture cultivates altruism, selfless service to the Nation, and ethos toward the Army and its mission. It sponsors continuous self-assessment, learning, and development that together enable the Army to be an adaptive, learning profession. Within that culture, members of the profession create an identity with a sense of calling and ownership over the advancement of the profession and the exemplary performance of its members, and serve in a brotherhood/sisterhood of fellow professionals with a shared sense of calling. The vocation requires a balance where effectiveness prevails over efficiency and places primary importance on maintaining the profession through investing in the development of its members.

"The Army profession campaign is as much about dialog and reflection as it is about research and analysis. But most importantly, this campaign is about the actions we will take to improve our profession. Therefore, the end of year report to senior leaders will ultimately change doctrine, leader development, training, education, evaluation, selection, and promotion. As we move forward, Iask each and every Soldier and all

Army civilians to take ownership of our profession and think deeply about how you want to improve our Army. Then, I invite you to join the conversation as we build the strongest, most capable, and adaptable force ever imagined."

SMA Charter Member Receives "Legion d'honneur"



CSM (Ret) Daniel R. Soria, one of our Association's Charter Members, was honored on 20 November 2011 when the Consul General of France, Romain Sermon personally presented the "Legion d'honneur" or Legion of Honor to him. The "Legion" is France's highest order (decoration) that recognizes military and civilians alike for their bravery or honorable service to the country. CSM Soria earned that distinction at 12:01 am on 6 June 1944 (D-Day) by jumping into the Normandy darkness as a member of the 101st Airborne Division while encountering much anti-aircraft fire. He was 21 kilometers from his drop zone which was near St. Mere Eglese. Since he and his fellow parachutists could not locate their howitzer guns, they became Infantry. CSM Soria was in several different POW camps in France. He "slipped" out to Germany in box cars for four days -sometimes being strafed and bombed by "friendly forces." He spent the remainder of his capture at various Stalags. He escaped 15 May 1945 and came home on 3 June 1945. CSM Soria accepted the "Legion" on behalf of 97 of his buddies who did not come back.

It is an honor to have CSM Dan Soria as a **Charter Member of this Association**. Thank you for your service.

DD 214s Available On Line

It's official – DD 214s are now available on line. The National Personnel Records Center (NPRC) provided the following website for veterans to gain access to their DD214s on line at http://vetrecs.archives.gov/. Type this address into your web browser address bar to get to the VA website to request your 214s online.

This may be particularly helpful when a veteran needs a copy of their DD-214 for employment purposes. NPRC is working to make it easier for veterans with computers and Internet access to obtain copies of documents from their military files.

Military veterans and the next of kin of deceased former military members may now use a new on-line military personnel records system to request documents.

Other individuals with a need for documents must still complete the Standard Form 180, which can be downloaded from the on-line website. Because the requestor will be asked to supply all information essential for NPRC to process the request, delays that normally occur when NPRC has to ask veterans for additional information will be minimized. The new web-based application was designed to provide better service on these requests by eliminating the records center mailroom and processing time.

Please pass this information on to former military personnel you may know and their dependents.
