HOME MADE TICK REPELLENT RECIPE: Ticks are as lethal as a venomous snake in the wrong scenario! Here's a simple homemade solution/repellent for your pets: For pets, add 1 cup of water to a spray bottle, followed by 2 cups of distilled white vinegar. Add two spoonfuls of vegetable or almond oil. To make a repellent that will also deter fleas, mix in a few spoonfuls of lemon juice, citrus oil, or peppermint oil, any of which will repel ticks and fleas while also creating a nicely scented repellent. Spray onto the pet's dry coat, staying away from sensitive areas including eyes, nose, mouth, and genitals. When outdoors for an extended period, spray this solution on two to three times per day. For you and your family: In a spray bottle, mix 2 cups of distilled white vinegar and 1 cup of water. To make a scented solution so you do not smell like bitter vinegar all day, add 20 drops of your favorite essential oil. Eucalyptus oil is a calm, soothing scent that also works as a tick repellent, while peppermint and citrus oils give off a strong crisp scent that also repel ticks. After mixing the solution, spray onto clothing, skin, and hair before going outdoors. Reapply every four hours to keep ticks at bay, and examine your skin and hair when back inside to make sure no ticks are on the body.

EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS:

CONTRA COSTA LIVESTOCK EMERGENCY EVACUATION RESPONSE TEAM: The Contra Costa LEERT is forming an equine disaster program in coordination with Animal Services. This year is likely to bring us a bad fire season with the long term drought we've had. Help is needed to locate staging areas and Intake areas in the case of a disaster. Staging areas need: a large area, parking lot, field, ranch etc. where trucks and trailers can pull in and line up so drivers can check in to receive their orders and leave to make rescue runs. Intake areas need: ranches, stables, equestrian parks, where horses can stay temporarily during a disaster. We need your help identifying these areas in Contra Costa County. Without these, we are limited in our ability to help horses in danger. Every horse owner should have an emergency plan, but at times when even the best plan doesn't work, then we will need to activate LEERT to help evacuate horses from fire areas. If you know of any potential staging or intake areas or you have a place that can be used for this purpose in an emergency, please contact the LEERT team. MESSAGE FROM MARIN HORSE COUNCIL: Emergency Preparedness and Equine Evacuation: Fires, earthquakes and (some winters) floods are threats to area barns. Unlike small companion animals, horses and other equines can't just be tossed in the car in an emergency. Marin County is facing a really dry / high fire risk season. Most barn fires occur between noon and 6 p.m. Heating and electrical systems, and particularly heat lamps, are frequent but not the only causes of barn fires. Ask your local fire department to inspect your barn and make safety recommendations. Be proactive. Be prepared. If you haven't had the Marin Horse Council come out to discuss emergency preparedness and equine evacuation call (415) 259-5783 or email eqevac@marinhorsecouncil.org to schedule an event for your barn and neighbors. ALERT TO DOG OWNERS - Horse Wormers are Toxic to Some Dogs: Dogs are frequent companions on horse properties and, let's face it, most are horse manure eating machines. It seems that some dogs have a "gene mutation that causes them to be prone to Ivermectin Toxicity." Horses pass the wormer 9 hours to 11 days after ingesting Ivermectin or moxidectin (Quest) and dogs start to show clinical signs of toxicity 4-12 hours after eating the horse manure. KEEP YOUR HORSE VACCINATED FOR WEST NILE VIRUS: Last year, Contra Costa County reported four human cases of West Nile, the highest number recorded in the nine Bay Area counties. This year West Nile has already been found in birds in Contra Costa County. The number of humans with West Nile virus continues to rise. There is a West Nile vaccine for horses, there isn't one for humans. The Center for Disease Control recommends using an EPA-certified mosquito repellant if you're going to be outdoors, and lists some additional prevention tips on their website, including: Wear long-sleeved shirts and long pants outdoors. Place mosquito netting over infant carriers when you are outdoors. Empty standing water from flower pots, pet food and water dishes, birdbaths, swimming pool covers, buckets, barrels, and cans. The CDC website lists varying degrees of symptoms, including: high fever, headache, neck stiffness, stupor, disorientation, and possibly paralysis, body aches, nausea, vomiting, and sometimes swollen lymph glands or a skin rash on the chest, stomach and back

ROADSIDE ASSISTANCE: Many people are unaware that AAA and many other Emergency Roadside Assistance programs do not handle horse trailers, only your pulling vehicle. Check your automotive insurance to be sure. If not covered, check out U.S. Rider Equestrian Roadside Assistance. www.usrider.org 1-800-844-1409. For peace of mind and protection on the road, count on USRider.

TRAIL/TRAVEL TIPS: Carry a personal kit with a substantial flashlight (keep the batteries out until needed), perhaps a hand-cranked light, signal mirrors, a whistle, glow sticks (which can be used to mark turns, to fasten to a hurt person/horse (blue for injury, red for emergency, white for camp or trail markers) and are also great for putting on kids while camping or in outdoor situations. The Australian Connection has light sticks for \$3.00 each or 3 to 10 for \$2.50 each or 11 or more for \$2.25 each. www.australianconnection.us

Carry a six inch length of rubber hose in your carry kit in case your horse is ever bitten in the nose by a rattlesnake while on the trail. The nose will swell until your horse can't breathe. If bitten, a hose placed in the horse's nostril will keep it from swelling shut.
