

CHECKLIST BEFORE MAILING DEFERRED ACTION REQUEST

Disclaimer: This document is for informational purposes only. While this document may be helpful in educating you about the requirements to file for Deferred Action, you should always consult with a licensed attorney before submitting any documentation to USCIS. Only an attorney can give you legal advice about your specific circumstances.

Each Deferred Action Request should include all of the following:

- € Forms and Fees:
 - € Form I-821D, Consideration of Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals;
 - € Form I-765, Application for Employment Authorization;
 - € Form I-765 WS;
 - € \$465 Application fee (\$380 for I-765 + \$85 biometrics) Check or money order to "U.S. Department of Homeland Security":
 - € Two passport photos (attach to I-765 application)
- € Eligibility Documents
 - € Proof of age/identity;
 - € Proof of entry into the United States before age 16;
 - € Proof of five years continuous residence in the U.S. from at least June 15, 2007 till present:
 - € Documents from 2007
 - € Documents from 2008
 - € Documents from 2009
 - € Documents from 2010
 - € Documents from 2011
 - € Documents from 2012
 - € Proof of presence in the U.S. on June 15, 2012;
 - € Proof of education status (in school, graduated high school, received GED, enrolled in GED) OR Proof of honorable discharge from U.S. Coast Guard or Armed Forces
- € If the applicant has any criminal issues (arrests, convictions), they should also include all Certificates of Disposition.

EXAMPLES OF ELIGIBILITY DOCUMENTS

I. PROOF OF IDENTITY/AGE

- 1) Best Evidence
 - o Passport;
 - o Birth Certificate¹ and with photo identification;
 - o National ID card (go to consulate);
 - o U.S. government issued ID (driver's license, EAD);
 - o School or military ID with photo.

II. PROOF OF ENTRY INTO THE UNITED STATES BEFORE AGE 16

- 1) Examples of Documents
 - o Form I-94;
 - o Entry stamp in passport;
 - o USCIS Notices:
 - o Travel records;
 - School records/medical records.

III. PROOF OF FIVE YEARS CONTINUOUS RESIDENCE IN U.S. FROM AT LEAST JUNE 15, 2007 TILL JUNE 15, 2012 AND PRESENCE IN U.S. ON JUNE 15, 2012

- 1) Examples of Other Documents Showing Residency/Presence
 - School records (transcripts, report cards);
 - o Military Records;
 - o Medical records/Immunization Records;
 - o Birth certificates of children born in the U.S.;
 - o Employment records (Job letter from employer in the US, Pay stubs)
 - o Rent receipts from housing in the United States;
 - o Bank statements from an account in the United States;
 - o Tax Returns;
 - o A copy of a recent lease or proof of property ownership in the United States
 - o Bills/letters showing the applicant's name and address in the United States for the past five years preceding June 15, 2012.

IV. PROOF OF EDUCATION STATUS (IN SCHOOL, GRADUATED HIGH SCHOOL, RECEIVED GED) OR PROOF OF HONORABLE DISCHARGE FROM U.S. COAST GUARD OR ARMED FORCES.

- 1) Examples of Other Documents Showing Education Status or Military Service
 - o School records (transcripts, report cards, certificates);
 - o High School Diploma or GED;
 - o Military Personnel/Health Records.

NOTE: This is <u>NOT AN EXCLUSIVE LIST</u> of documents that U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Services may consider in support of the Deferred Action request.
