Welcome to ASU ProMod in partnership with Cesar Chavez High School and the Phoenix Union High School District. This unique opportunity connects your high school courses, ASU courses, and the support you need to transition to college. Your high school teachers are your ASU instructors and will facilitate your learning through projects integrated across all 4 courses. While participation in this program does not guarantee admission to ASU, we will support you as you select and apply to ASU or your college of choice. You will earn ASU credit upon successful completion of the course requirements, enrollment at ASU directly after high school graduation, and completion of your first semester at ASU.

How will I learn through projects? Project-based learning is an opportunity for you as a student to learn, engage and reflect on your own ideas as you learn the content in your courses. You will be an active participant in the class as you build communication and presentation skills, time management skills, research and inquiry skills and self-assessment and reflection skills. Some activities and assignments will be with a small group while others will be your own individual work. Each project will be led by a driving question that is connected across all four courses.
