# How do I apply?

Note: Applications and all supporting documents must be postmarked by the appropriate deadline. For more information, send an email to admissions@siue.edu or phone (800) 447-SIUE (toll-free IL and local MO) or (618) 650-3705.

If you do not enroll in the semester for which you applied but wish to enroll in a later term, you may need to submit a new application. Additional documentation is due by the deadline for the semester in which you plan to enter. Please refer to the online undergraduate catalog at **siue.edu/registrar**, or contact an admission counselor for academic eligibility requirements.

# **Application Fee**

A non-refundable application fee of \$30 must accompany this application. Payment should be made in U.S. dollars by check or money order payable to SIUE. You may pay by credit card when applying online. Applications received without the fee will remain incomplete until the fee and all supporting documents are received. Applicants who change their term of entry may update their file by submitting a new application for the next two terms without another application fee. Undergraduate students currently enrolled at SIUE are not assessed an additional fee to apply for a change in degree status. Requests for a fee waiver are available online at siue.edu/apply and should be sent to the Director of Admissions.

# Freshmen Applicants

This category includes high school seniors, anyone who has graduated from high school, or anyone who has completed the General Educational Development (G.E.D.) examination and who has not subsequently attempted college work.

- A. If you are a high school senior or have graduated from high school within the last five years, submit an official high school transcript and ACT/SAT scores to SIUE. The transcript for high school seniors should show 6th-, 7th-, or 8th-semester class rank and GPA. A final official high school transcript verifying graduation must be submitted as soon as it is available. The transcript for applicants who have graduated from high school must verify graduation and should display final semester rank. ACT/SAT scores that appear on your high school transcript are accepted.
- B. If you graduated from high school five or more years ago, you must have an official high school transcript sent to SIUE, verifying your graduation and showing your final semester class rank and GPA. ACT/SAT scores are not required. However, if you have taken the ACT/SAT test, you are encouraged to submit the scores to SIUE.
- C. If you have passed the G.E.D. examination, ask the County Superintendent of Schools to send an official copy of your G.E.D. scores to SIUE. Also submit an official copy of your high school transcript if your high school class graduated within the past five years. ACT/SAT scores are not required. However, if you have taken the ACT/SAT test, you are encouraged to submit the scores to SIUE.

# **Transfer Applicants**

This category includes anyone who has attempted college course work since high school graduation or passed the GED examination, and has not previously attended SIUE.

- **A.** If you've completed 30 or more semester hours of transfer-level credit, you must request official transcripts from each college you attended.
- **B.** If you've completed fewer than 30 semester hours of transfer-level credit, you must have your high school send the credentials described in the Freshman Applicant category. In addition, you must request official college transcripts from each college you attended.

# **Visiting Student Applicants**

This category includes anyone who has at least a high school diploma or equivalent and wishes to enroll in undergraduate courses for credit, but is not interested in pursuing a baccalaureate degree at SIUE.

The only document required is the completed application, along with a \$30 application fee. However, you may be required to present evidence of prerequisite completion at the time of registration.

Visiting students are not eligible to receive financial aid. However, if a visiting student is currently pursuing a degree at another post-secondary institution, the student may be eligible for VA benefits or student employment. Students wishing to apply for student employment or receive VA benefits need to submit appropriate documentation confirming their degree-seeking status at a parent institution.

Students in visiting status may not accumulate more than 30 semester hours at SIUE. If a student has accumulated 30 semester hours of credit and wishes to continue enrollment at SIUE, he/she must apply to the University as a degree-seeking student and satisfy appropriate criteria. Continued enrollment will not be permitted until the student satisfies admission criteria or appeals to the Director of Admissions.

Applicants still in high school may be considered by the Director of Admissions for admission as visiting students.

Applicants previously denied admission in degree-seeking categories are not admissible as visiting students.

# **Returning Applicants**

This includes anyone who has previously attended SIUE but has not attended the University within the last 12 months.

# **Degree-seeking Applicants**

If you plan to pursue an undergraduate degree, you should apply for degree-seeking status (see question 2 on the application). This is required to make you eligible for most financial aid and veterans' education benefits. The documents required are listed by applicant category. To be considered official, your documents must be mailed directly to the Office of Admissions by the institution that issues them.

# **Intended Area of Study**

Your indication of an intended major on your online application for admission provides SIUE with your academic interests so that we can provide you with information related to your potential major. After you submit your application for admission, all references to your "Major" and "Degree" in the Application Summary will still indicate "Undeclared," regardless of the intended majors you indicated on the online application. SIUE does not direct declare new undergraduate students at the time of admission. A limited number of students will be considered for direct entry or conditional entry programs after acceptance. Others will have the opportunity to discuss the process of declaring your major and degree with an academic advisor during your first advising meeting.

# Other College or University Credit

Students who have earned college credit from other regionally accredited institutions must have official transcripts sent from the granting institution directly to:

Please note, any college credits obtained while attending high school also must be reported on an official transcript from the college or university to be considered for transfer credit. # Undergraduate Areas of Study Available at SIUE\*

SIUE offers undergraduate areas of study in the College of Arts and Sciences, School of Business, School of Education, School of Engineering, School of Nursing and the pre-pharmacy curriculum for the School of Pharmacy. Most students (except transfer students who have a qualifying associate or higher degree) enter SIUE as an undeclared student in the College of Arts and Sciences. A limited number of freshman applicants will be considered for direct entry into the Schools of Engineering (SG, BI, BN, BP, BQ, C6, CP, D1, D8), Business (SB, B1, BF, BG, BO, C1, C9, CD, CG, CO, CS, CY, H3, D2), and Nursing (DQ, SN), as well as conditional entry into the School of Pharmacy (EX). Preferential consideration will be given to those completing the application process and the Supplemental Profile (siue.edu/direct) by December 2, 2013. Admission for these direct options is competitive and most students will enter these academic programs through the traditional process.

# Scholarships Available at SIUC

# Meridian Scholarships

Award Amount: Full tuition, mandatory fees, room and board scholarships awarded annually as funding is available.

Criteria: Through a competitive process, admitted freshmen with an  $ACT \ge 27$  (1210 SAT) will be considered. All students who meet the criteria are encouraged to apply.

**Application Deadline:** Submit admission application including Supplemental Profile on or before 12/2/2013. For more information, see question 14 on the application or visit **siue.edu/meridian**.

Award Renewal: Award is good for eight semesters. Students must complete 12 hours per semester and maintain a 3.25 cumulative GPA.

# Cougar Pride Scholarships

Award Amount: Up to \$16,000 over four years awarded for freshmen and transfers as funding is available.

Criteria: Through a competitive process, admitted freshmen with an ACT ≥ 23 (1050 SAT) will be considered. Students transferring from a regionally accredited institution must have earned a minimum 3.0 GPA in at least 24 semester hours in course work that is transferrable to SIUE, including students with a recognized associate's degree. All students who meet the criteria are encouraged to apply.

**Application Deadline:** Preferential consideration will be given to students completing the application for admission on or before 12/2/2013. FAFSA completion is required.

Award Renewal: Award is good for eight semesters. Students must complete 12 hours per semester and maintain a 2.9 cumulative GPA.

# Johnetta Haley Scholarships

Award Amount: Up to \$12,000 over four years awarded for freshmen and transfers as funding is available.

Criteria: Through a competitive process, admitted freshmen with an ACT ≥ 23 (1050 SAT) will be considered. Students transferring from a regionally accredited institution must have earned a minimum 3.0 GPA in at least 24 semester hours in course work that is transferrable to SIUE, including students with a recognized associate's degree. This scholarship is designed to support enrollment of students who are underrepresented in their anticipated field of study. All students who meet the criteria are encouraged to apply.

**Application Deadline:** Preferential consideration will be given to students completing the application for admission on or before 12/2/2013. FAFSA completion is required.

Award Renewal: Award is good for eight semesters. Students must complete 12 hours per semester and maintain a 2.9 cumulative GPA.

#### Guarantee The

**Award Amount:** Amounts will vary. After completion of the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA), and applying all available State and Federal programs to student's account, SIUE will assist families with filling remaining unmet financial need. Awards will be made as funding is available.

Criteria: Admitted Illinois freshmen with an ACT ≥ 19 (900 SAT), \$0 Expected Family Contribution (EFC) and family income levels at or below federal poverty guidelines are eligible.

**Application Deadline:** Preferential consideration will be given to students completing the application for admission on or before 12/2/2013 and the FAFSA as soon as possible after 1/1/2014.

**Award Renewal:** Student's financial eligibility for the program will be reviewed annually. Award is good for up to eight semesters. Students must complete 12 hours per semester and maintain a 2.0 cumulative GPA.

# Out of State Scholarships

#### **GEO Scholarship**

Award Amount: Freshmen and transfers meeting criteria are eligible for up to \$9,400 (based on 15 semester hours of credit) as funding is available.

Criteria: Freshmen: First-time, full-time non-resident freshmen with a composite ACT score 23-26 (1050-1200 SAT). Transfers: First-time, full-time non-resident transfers with a cumulative college GPA  $\geq$  3.0/4.0 in at least 24 transferable credits hours. Students who have been recognized for outstanding talent through a competitive departmental process may also be considered.

**Application Deadline:** Preferential consideration will be given to students completing the application for admission on or before 12/2/2013. FAFSA completion is required.

**Award Renewal:** This scholarship is available for four years for freshmen and up to three years for transfers. For greater savings, students are encouraged to file for Illinois residency to receive in-state tuition if eligible. Switching residency will cancel the GEO Scholarship.

#### Premier Scholarship

Award Amount: Eligible freshman receive the in-state tuition rate. The scholarship equates to an annual reduction in tuition of approximately \$11,000 (based on 15 semester hours of credit) as funding is available.

Criteria: First-time, full-time non-resident freshmen with a composite ACT  $\geq$  27 (1220 SAT).

**Application Deadline:** Preferential consideration will be given to students completing the application for admission on or before 12/2/2013. FAFSA completion is required.

**Award Renewal:** This scholarship is available for four years. Students are encouraged to file for Illinois residency to receive in-state tuition if eligible. Switching residency will cancel the Premier Scholarship.

### **Tuition and Fees**

Newly enrolled undergraduate students will pay a guaranteed tuition rate for four continuous academic years.
