Because RMC has no control over which counties may adop such rules, nor what the specific rules might require, no reference has been made on this form to allow for telephone appearances. If a particular county has such a rule, however, that county should create an attachment to this Summons and Complaint explaining the rule and the requirements.
	Questions have arisen whether the complaint must be verified. Although not required to commence the action, a verified complaint allows the court to enter a default judgment without any further action or proceeding. If the complaint is not verified, upon a default the court would have to hear testimony under oath or receive affidavits to support the claim before a judgment can be entered. Providing the opportunity to verify the complain at the time of filing expedites the process.
