The Snow Hill American Legion chapter holds its meetings in this late nineteenth-century five-course common bond brick building that stands at the west end of an almost complete row of period brick commercial buildings that were erected shortly after the 1893 Snow Hill fire. Most of the buildings share intact Victorian storefront cornices as well as corbelled brick decoration that enriches the front parapet wall. Also common to several buildings are the segmental arches on the second floor with alternating colored brick patterns. As an integral part of this Green Street block, the American Legion hall adds to the period character of this Victorian commercial row. The store is designated on the 1895 insurance map as carrying general merchandise.

The American Legion hall stands at 116 Green Street on the northeast corner of the intersection of Bank and Green streets. The two-story, threebay brick commercial building faces southeast.

Built in 1894-95, this two-story, rectangular commercial building was laid in five-course common bond with a parapet wall disguising a flat roof. Continuous brick walls extend across two bays of the adjacent Western Auto store, which indicates the five-bay block was erected at one time with two storefronts. The American Legion front has been partially reworked with a brick kneewall below large glass display windows. Directly adjacent to the right display window is a glazed door that provides access to a stair. A Victorian bracketed cornice stretches above above the Amerian Legion sign. The second floor is marked by three segmental arched window openings with alternating raised colored bricks. The sash have been replaced. Defining the top of the front wall is a corbelled brick cornice.

The west facade borders Bank Street and the asymmetrical elevation includes a single four-over-four sash window on the first floor along with the remnants of a painted advertisement and two smaller segmental arched openings. The second floor is pierced by four segmental arched openings that have been filled with replacement single-pane sash windows. Interior brick stove stacks pierce the parapet side wall.

The back of the building follows along similar features and the interior of the structure was not seen.
