- 29) Many people harassed me by voice over listings not entered by me. What may be confusing to understand, is that other than open relays, the only list maintained was that of a personal list, which Had no reference to the plaintiff and was roughly 5% of the size of the other import zones.

- 32) I built relays.osirusoft.com to complement my own personal use of my mail servers, so that I could personally filter incoming unsolicited email AKA "spam". - 33) Said phone call was well over a year ago and due to extenuating circumstances both in my business and with the ddos attack, I'm pretty sure I didn't have patience for either of you. I believe you demanded that I remove your company's alleged listing, to which I replied that I could not access my system, due to a dos attack. At this point, you said you were going to sue me, so I saw no point in continuing the conversation. At the point prior to hanging up, I may have said, "See you in court".
