RE: Ordination Renewal/Review 2010

Date: January 15, 2010

The Annual Conference has granted the authority for ordination to the district board. The 1999 Ministerial Leadership Paper "encourages regular reviews of ordained individuals by district ministry commissions in order to assist the district boards in assessing whether, in specific instances, there has been a change in the relationship between the ordained person and the Church of the Brethren, and these reviews may be synchronized with the renewal of ordination cards every five years." The renewal/review process is now underway and is to be completed by each district by December 31, 2010.

Ordained leaders in the Church of the Brethren, may be identified in one of nine ways:

- 1. Pastor of a congregation
- 2. Person serving a congregation in a self-supporting ministry
- 3. Administrator or teacher in a theological seminary
- 4. Teacher of religion in a school, college, or university
- 5. Staff persons with districts, the General Board and other Annual Conference Agencies
- 6. Missionary assigned to pastoral or evangelistic duties.
- 7. Chaplain
- 8. Person serving in a specialized ministry (e.g., youth ministry, Christian education, camp administrator, ecumenical ministries, spiritual direction, pastoral counselors).
- 9. Ministers retired from their area of service.

Our records indicate that your category is number 9, "Ministers retired from their area of service." We are grateful for your many years of ministerial service and leadership. You have much insight and wisdom to share with the church in these retirement years. We value your presence in the life and witness of the church. We have created a special form for retirees to complete as part of the 2010 Ordination Renewal process.

Each case above assumes that you are a member in good standing in a Church of the Brethren congregation. Being a "member in good standing" means that you are an active (presence, prayers, substance) participant in the life of the congregation unless you are non-resident. If you are non-resident, but want to maintain membership in a Church of the Brethren congregation, the congregation should be clear about and supportive of you as a ministerial leader. Otherwise, you are encouraged to move your membership to a church where you can be active. If you are living in an area where there is no Church of the Brethren congregation and want to maintain ordination in the Church of the Brethren, membership in a Church of the Brethren congregation is still required, and you are expected to be a "member in good standing" as described above. Please remember you have the responsibility for nurturing the relationship in any of these circumstances.

The Ministerial Leadership paper, adopted by the 1999 Annual Conference, contains a section on ministerial accountability that applies to all ordained ministers in the Church of the Brethren. Introduction:

(excerpts from the 1999 Ministerial Leadership paper)

- The district boards have been given the authority for ordination in the Church of the Brethren. They ordain persons on behalf of the denomination. (O. Authority of the District Board)
- Based as it is upon the Spirit's empowerment but also upon a process of discernment and designation by the church, ordained leadership is not seen as a right as much as a gift and a naming of gifts... Regular reviews of ordained persons by District Ministry Commissions are encouraged in order to assist the District Boards in assessing whether, in specific instances, there has been a change in the relationship between the ordained person and the Church of the Brethren, and these reviews may be synchronized with the renewal of ordination cards every five years.

(G. Guidelines for Discontinuing the Call to Ordained Leadership)

If the District Board and the congregation approve the candidate for ordination, the person shall be ordained to ministerial leadership with the laying on of hands during a worship service.

- Will you, with God as your helper, carry out faithfully the obligations of the ministry: preaching the Word to the age in which you live, visiting the sick and the brokenhearted, seeking the lost, comforting the troubled and distressed, and by word and example leading all with whom you minister into the fullness of the grace of Christ?

As you complete this form we ask that you prayerfully study and remember the words of introduction, the vows you took as you were ordained to the setapart ministry in the Church of the Brethren the accountability we have to Christ and one another for our ministry.
