Calligraphy Class at Library
Learn the art of beautiful writing

The Georgetown Library on Cleland Street is offering a calligraphy class on Saturday, February 16th, from 10 a.m. until noon. Natasha Lawrence, professional calligrapher to the Historic Charleston Foundation and instructor at the Charleston Museum, will give each participant fun, hands-on instruction. By the end of class, students will be able to use their calligraphy pens to create classic Italian Italics lettering.

“Calligraphy is such a practical art, because you can personalize and beautify wedding invitations, greeting cards, journals, gift tags and personal correspondence,” explained Lawrence. “We’re not only going to explore different calligraphy pens, but also view calligraphy artwork, books and resources.”

The \$10 class includes the pens, workbook, practice paper and ink you will need. As a bonus, each participant will be able to take a calligraphy pen home.

“No artistic ability is necessary, but we’ll bet you’ll discover some during this class,” said library Assistant Director Trudy Bazemore. “Be warned: class size is limited, and spots are filling up fast.”
