Score Point 1 – Organization is haphazard and disjointed throughout. Even after rereading, the reader remains confused. The lack of organization...obscures the main point. The writer begins by introducing a teacher, but fails to organize information about the teacher effectively. The end of the paper is personal, not about the teacher.

Score Point 2 – The writing lacks a clear organizational structure. The writer shows attempts at sequencing and an occasional organizational device. The beginning is not inviting, the body is underdeveloped, and the ending has no sense of closure.

Score Point 3 – Writing shows attempts at organization. The beginning is acceptable, but the conclusion is very weak. The same few transitional devices are overused: “also”; “important”; and “that is why”. “That is all” is not an acceptable conclusion.

Score Point 4 – Order and structure are present, but are formulaic. There is clear sequencing, but organization is predictable. The beginning and ending are recognizable, but do not command the reader’s attention. “Most of the adults that influences me tend to have three of some traits.” And “in the end,…” are not effective. Organization helps the reader, despite some weaknesses.

Score Point 5 – Writing has an inviting beginning and a satisfying ending. The organization enhances the central idea and its development. Effective sequencing allows the reader to follow the development easily. The overall structure of the paper fits the topic. The writer does not rely on formulaic transitions but develops each paragraph with sophistication that keeps the reader involved.

Score Point 6 – Paper has a strong, inviting beginning and smooth, effective transitions. Transitions create a flow within and between paragraphs. Creative sequencing allows for ease of reading. Order and structure are compelling. The body reinforces organization, both within and between paragraphs, and ideas flow clearly. The use of the four-word clause “I would not be” provides a compelling conclusion to the paper.
