I want to start off by saying that I do not own a gun. I have many friends that do and have shot guns many times. It is a right given to us by the constitution to bear arms and protect ourselves. Everyone that I know who has exercised that right is a law abiding citizen, has made something of themselves, and contributes to society in a positive way. I happen to live in Cheshire where Dr. Pettit's family was brutally murdered. It happened about 2 blocks from our home. Every time a crime like this happens, whether we personally know the victims or not, our lives are forever changed! Yes, we all want to see a stop put to these mass shootings and crimes of human destruction, but taking guns away from law abiding citizens or preventing them from purchasing a gun legally is not the answer.

If I am not mistaken, it is not so easy to get a gun permit within the current laws that are in place. I believe the process is to go and take a certified NRA course and apply for a local permit from the chief of police. You need to show proof of the completed training, attach a couple of letters (character references) from friends or acquaintances, be subject to a background check, and be fingerprinted. After that you can apply for your state permit and then a concealed carry permit which involves more training. When you finally purchase a gun it is registered with the authorities and can be tracked. I am sure there are other formalities and requirements in place too. I agree with this process and would like to see more time spent enforcing the current laws already on the book.

I am also in favor of new laws that affect the criminals and protect our law abiding citizens.
